How WIC started

The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children

- Authorized under Child Nutrition Act
- Administered by USDA, Food & Nutrition Services
- Managed by Public Health Division, Oregon Health Authority





OUR VISION

Ensure optimal nutrition and lifelong health for every Oregon family.

What does WIC do?

4 main services:



Nutrition-Focused Counseling



Breastfeeding Support



Healthy Foods



Community Referrals









WIC counselors...

- Offer personalized nutrition consultation with routine follow ups
- Provide breastfeeding support and encouragement
- Connect participants to care beyond WIC, if needed
- Get participants set up with a card to buy WIC foods





Families are eligible for WIC if:

✓Live in Oregon

✓ Fit into one of the categories

pregnant, postpartum up to 1 year if breastfeeding, an infant, or a child under 5 years old

Have a household income less than or equal to the income guidelines

WIC WELCOMES ALL.




Citizenship is NOT required to receive WIC services

Participation in WIC will not impact a participant's ability to receive other services or to attain citizenship.

WIC food shopping

- 508 stores/vendors accept eWIC benefits across the state
- \$51 million spent at WIC-authorized grocery stores, pharmacies, farm stands and farmer's markets last year
- WIC Shopper App simplifies shopping!

Farm Direct Nutrition Program

Breastfeeding Peer Counseling Program



WIC participants also receive benefits from other assistance programs:

87% receive OHP



61% receive SNAP



11% receive TANF





WHO WE SERVED



110,967

Women, infants and children who participated in WIC

65,179 WIC families served



of all pregnant women served by WIC

→ 70%

are working families

3 OUT OF 4 ***

participants are infants and children under five

- BREASTFEEDING 94% 32

WIC moms start out breastfeeding 32%

WIC moms breastfeed exclusively for six months

ECONOMIC BENEFITS OF WIC

508 LOCAL STORES ACCEPTING WIC:

- 169 Independent stores
- 135 Local or regional chains
- 132 National chain stores
- 72 Pharmacies

\$51.4 MILLION

Total dollars spent by WIC participants at local stores

HEALTHY FOOD ACCESS

To be a WIC store, it must carry:

- At least 8 kinds of fresh fruits and vegetables
- Whole grain products
- Lowfat milk
- Lowfat yogurt
- · Canned/dried beans



WIC FARM DIRECT NUTRITION PROGRAM

The Farm Direct Nutrition Program (FDNP) provides families with an additional source of nutritious food and education on selecting and preparing fresh produce.

714 PARTICIPATING FARMERS

at local farmers markets and farm stands

\$668,420 FDNP dollars paid

to local farmers
