**Goal**: Develop a framework for state-supported water planning and management at the water region and/or basin level



- Scope narrowed to Place-Based Integrate Water Resources Planning






### What is Place-Based Planning?

#### **Pilot Program: SB 266 (2015)**

- Recommendation of the 2012 IWRS
- 4 planning groups began in 2016
- Legislature invested \$2.4M
- OWRD provided planning guidelines and support, program guidance, data, and technical assistance
















### Place-Based Planning Status

- State Recognition of 3
   Place-Based Plans in 2022
- Independent evaluation conducted by the National Policy and Consensus Center
- Pilot program to sunset July 2023



- Agency capacity

# **II. PBP: State Recognition**

#### State Recognized Plans:

- Should receive support from an interagency team and funding for implementation coordination
- Be required to submit biennial reports to maintain state recognition
- May be used to identify common themes across basins to help inform updates to the IWRS



# **II. PBP: Agency Support and Capacity**

Fund data inventories to support PBP

#### **Serious Concerns or Questions Raised:**

Fund formalized interagency team to support PBP

Fund OWRD regional/basin staff to support PBP



# **II. PBP: Grant Program**

### Funding should enable:

- Community engagement
- Plan development
- Facilitation
- Implementation coordination
- Plan updates



# **II. PBP: Grant Program**

### **Grant Program Should:**

- Build upon lessons learned
- Require cost-share
- Include guidelines for group operating protocols
- Foster trust
- Ensure a transparent and collaborative process
