

Automatic Voter Registration is Safe & Secure

- Registration lists are continuously updated to ensure that only eligible voters can register to vote.
- Data from local, state and federal partners is used to remove anyone who moves, is not a citizen, passes away or is otherwise ineligible to vote.
- Oregon voters are also required to attest to their qualifications -including citizenship -- at the time they submit their ballot.
- Motor voter has operated for 7 years without any security breaches.
- <u>21 states (and DC) have followed our lead</u>



We can build on the success of Motor Voter by <u>partnering</u> with the Oregon Health Plan.

Approximately 171,000 people on the Oregon Health Plan are eligible, but not registered to vote.

HB 2107 will expand automatic voter registration to people on the Oregon Health Plan.

Expanding Access to Our Democracy



Changes to HB 2107:

- Removal of Section 9 Pilot Program.
- Additions:
 - First, it clarifies that election officials, not OHA, is determining who is eligible to register to vote.
 - Second, this version uses the most current data to determine a person's citizenship status.
 - Third, this version clarifies procedures for eligible OHA applicants without a signature on file.
