Dear Committee members, below you will find a list of LCs that are planned for introduction.

LC Number	Dated	Summary
LC 514	9/01/22	Provides that certified parole and probation officer employed by State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision qualifies as police officer under Public Employees Retirement System. Provides that certified parole and probation officer employed on effective date of Act is entitled to service in retirement system as police officer for all service performed as certified parole and probation officer employed by board.
LC 516	10/12/22	Authorizes release of sex offender information to certain entities if re lease is in public interest. Provides immunity from criminal and civil liability if lawful release of information is performed in good faith.
LC 524	11/03/22	Changes title of "district medical examiner" to "county medical examiner." Changes title of "medical-legal death investigator" to "medicolegal death investigator." Eliminates partial reimbursement by state of certain county autopsy expenditures. Modifies types of deaths medical investigator must investigate. Removes authority of district attorney to order blood or urine samples for analysis in death investigation. Authorizes medical examiner to take vitreous fluid sample for analysis in death investigation. Authorizes vitreous fluid sample to be taken when death results from

		motor vehicle accident. Limits duty of Chief Medical Examiner to perform autopsies to circumstances when office has sufficient capacity.
LC 3632	2/17/23	Allows circuit court judge to authorize execution of search warrant outside judicial district for interrelated conduct carried on in more than one county. Defines "interrelated conduct." Allows judge assigned to judicial district to authorize execution of search warrant in that judicial district regardless of whether regularly elected or appointed judge for that judicial district is available. Provides examples of other persons who may accompany law enforcement during execution of a warrant.
