SB 785 -1 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Provides that a person may park a vehicle in any parking space regulated by an out-of-service meter operated by a city unless notice otherwise prohibiting parking is posted. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Examples when measure would apply
- Amendment addresses when parking prohibited subsequent to vehicle having parked in space
- Minimize consumer uncertainty where out-of-service meters are common place

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-1 Provides that a person may park a vehicle in a parking space regulated by an out-of-service meter operated by any public body as defined by ORS 174.109. States that a person may not be cited for a vehicle that is lawfully parked in a space when parking in the space becomes prohibited.

BACKGROUND:

Senate Bill 785 would allow a person to park a vehicle in any parking space regulated by an out-of-service meter: (a) If the space is one in which the vehicle would otherwise be allowed to park; (b) For the maximum amount of time that would otherwise be allowed for the space; and (c) Without payment of the parking fee that would otherwise be charged for the space for that amount of time unless a notice prohibiting parking in the space is clearly posted at the space and where payment of the fee would be required if the meter were in service.

This summary has not been adopted or officially endorsed by action of the committee.
