SB 818 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to develop a list of suicide risk assessment and treatment continuing education opportunities that are tailored to health care providers based on licenses. Requires OHA to update the list once every two years. Establishes requirements on what the continuing training and education must include. Requires OHA to consult with licensing boards, universities, and experts on suicide assessment and treatment. Allows OHA to contract with a third-party as necessary to develop the continuing education opportunities. Requires OHA to publish the list of continuing education opportunities on the OHA website. Adds acupuncturist to the list of licenses that are required to report any suicide assessment. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

BACKGROUND:

According to the Oregon Health Authority (OHA), sixty to seventy percent of individuals who die by suicide see a medical or behavioral healthcare professional in the year before death (<u>link</u> to OHA Suicide Intervention Training website). Senate Bill 48 (2017) requires that certain behavioral and physical healthcare providers to report to their licensing boards, at re-licensure, any continuing education activities related to suicide assessment or intervention.

Senate Bill 818 requires the Oregon Health Authority to develop a list of continuing education opportunities related to suicide prevention and tailored to health care providers based on licensure.
