#### WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Makes individuals eligible to apply for certification as water right examiners if they have been employed by an irrigation district, drainage district, water improvement district, or water control district for seven or more years.

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

### **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

-1 Requires a district employee to additionally have seven or more years of relevant technical experience conducting similar work in order to be eligible to apply for certification as water right examiner.

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Water right transactions and transfers are processed by the Oregon Water Resource Department (OWRD) and approved by certified water right examiners (CWREs). The CWRE license can be obtained from the Oregon State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying after successful completion of the CWRE exam administered by OWRD. Currently registration for the CWRE exam is open to registered geologists, professional engineers, and land surveyors. As of this year, there are 217 CWREs in Oregon, 30 percent of which are located within the Portland metro area.

House Bill 3187 would make individuals eligible to apply for certification as water right examiners if they have been employed by an irrigation district, drainage district, water improvement district, or water control district for seven or more years.
