# WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Establishes Community Informational Exchange Board. Specifies board membership and definitions. Requires board to study community information exchanges (CIEs) and make recommendations on best practices. Requires board to refer to report from Health Information Technology Oversight Council and to appoint specified work groups. Requires Department of Administrative Services to evaluate CIEs and publish list of CIEs that align with board-identified best practices. Sunsets June 30, 2028.

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued

#### **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

## **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

-1 Replaces Department of Administrative Services with Oregon Health Authority. Replaces definitions to include health care providers. Modifies directives for Community Information Exchange Board to make recommendations and convene work groups. Requires board to monitor outcomes and report to legislative committees annually.

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued

#### **BACKGROUND:**

A community information exchange (CIE) is a network of health care and social service partners that uses a digital platform that allows authorized access to things like a shared resource directory, "closed loop" referrals, reporting, social needs screening, and other features designed to connect people to multiple supports and social services efficiently. House Bill 4150 (2022) directed the Health Information Technology Oversight Council within the Oregon Health Authority to convene a work group that made recommendations and produced a report on how the state could leverage CIEs to improve social and health outcomes. As part of its recommendations, the report advocated for establishing a statewide system of governance for CIEs.

House Bill 3303 establishes the Community Information Exchange Board that would study and make recommendations on CIEs and requires the Department of Administrative Services to publish a list of CIEs that align with best practices based on the recommendations of the board.
