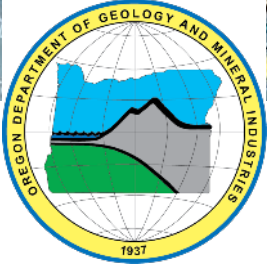

Bills to support DOGAMI IT modernization

Bill #	BILL SUMMARY
<u>SB220</u>	Relating to the DOGAMI electronic permitting system. Requires payment of additional 25% surcharge on certain assessments by DOGAMI. Establishes Electronic Permitting System Subaccount.
<u>SB221</u>	Relating to the DOGAMI electronic permitting system. Requires DOGAMI to collect 10.7% surcharge on use of electronic permitting system for deposit into subaccount. Establishes Electronic Permitting System Subaccount.
<u>SB222</u>	Relating to payments to DOGAMI by credit card. Authorizes DOGAMI to accept payments by credit card and to add fee to credit card transactions.



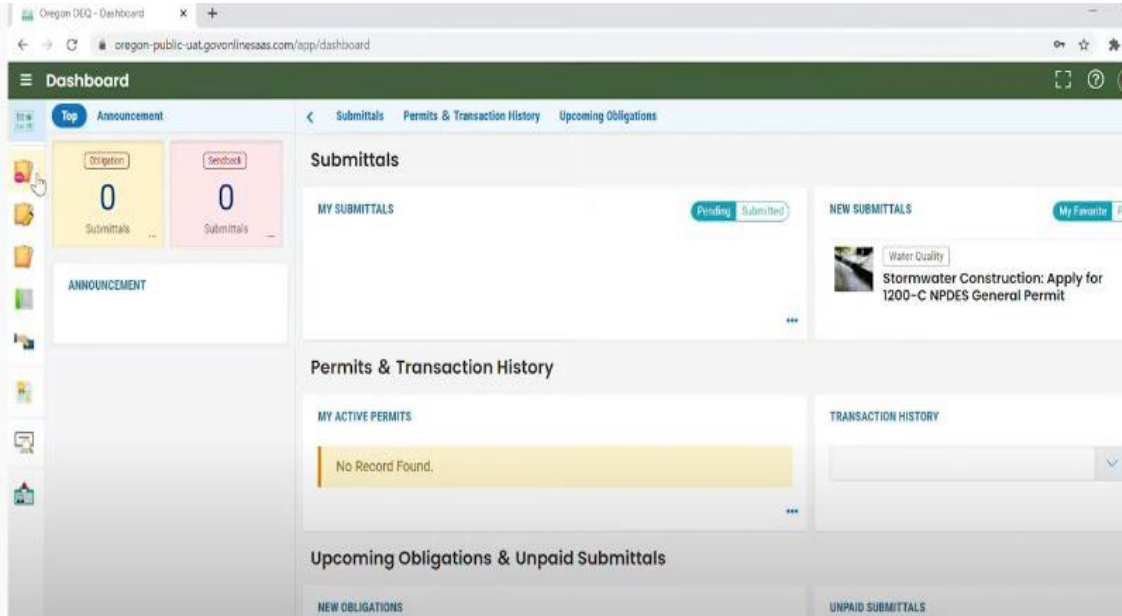
SB 222 – Credit Cards

- Mineral Lands Regulation and Reclamation Program (MLRR) collects over \$2 million annually in permit fees, mostly as paper checks.
- Credit card payments are a desired convenience and efficiency.
- SB 222 authorizes DOGAMI to accept credit cards and pass the bank fees onto the payee.
- The agency would not *require* payment by credit card and would continue to accept checks and bank transfers.



ePermitting & IT Modernization

Example of an online permitting portal



Supported by a solid business case, built at legislative direction, using enterprise guidance, and leveraging existing state resources.

Realization of an online customer and permit management system (ePermitting)

Development and Implementation

- DOGAMI Policy Option Package #101 requests General Fund to configure and build system. Includes vendor contract and two staff positions.

OR

- SB 220 – 25% fee surcharge (Other Fund)

System Maintenance

Ongoing maintenance of the system funded through technology fee on permit transactions in the system. (SB 221 - 10.7% technology fee)

ePermitting & IT Modernization

Phase 1: Development and Implementation

(A) General Fund (SB 5510)

OR

(B) SB 220, 25% fee surcharge on all permit payments

2024 - 2026

2026 - 2028

Phase 2: Annual Operation and Maintenance

SB 221, 10.7% technology fee on permit payments in ePermitting system

SB 222, accept credit card payments
