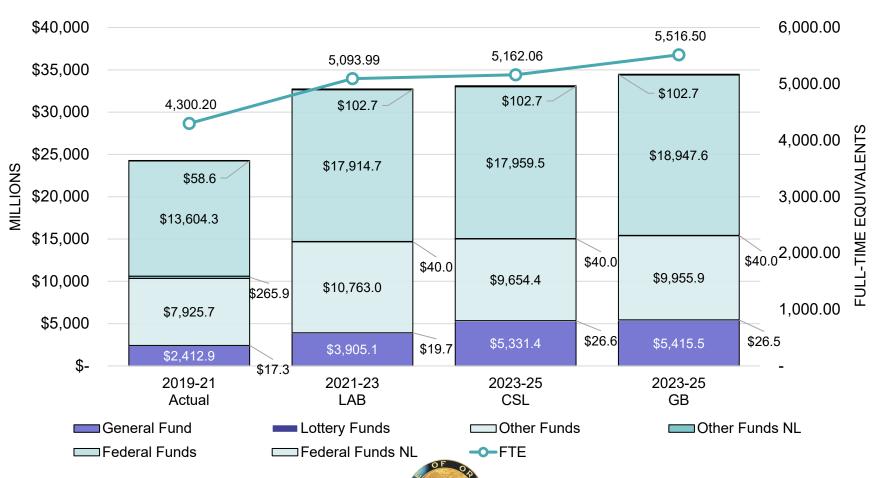

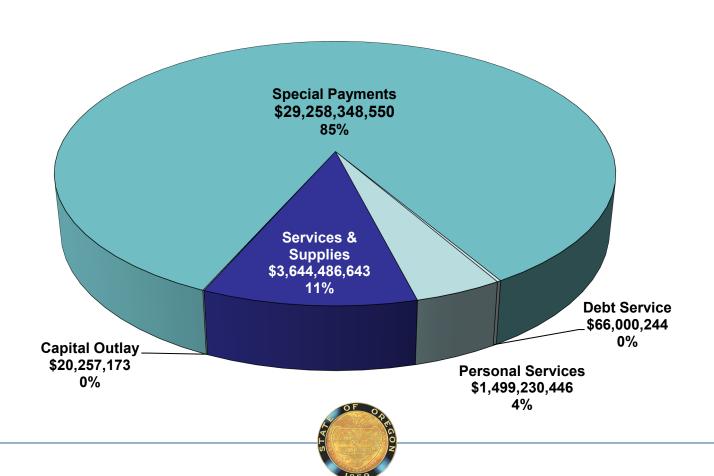
Oregon Health Authority Expenditure History + 2023-25 Governor's Budget





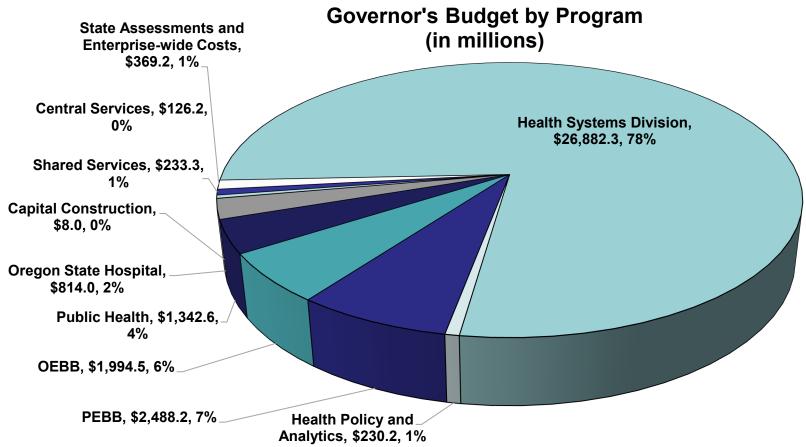

Oregon Health Authority Revenue Sources

OHA is primarily funded by Federal Funds (55 percent) and Other Funds (29 percent)

Medicaid:

- Federal participation in Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program
- Hospital Taxes, Taxes on CCOs and insurers, Cigarette and Tobacco Product Taxes

Non-Medicaid Behavioral Health: Marijuana Tax, Cigarette / Tobacco Product Taxes, Opioid Settlement Funds, Beer and Wine Tax, Lottery, Criminal Fines, federal grants

PEBB and OEBB: Insurance premiums and program charges

Public Health: Federal grants, Cigarette/Tobacco Product Tax, fees, program revenue

Oregon State Hospital: Insurance billing, Disproportionate Share Hospital payments, enterprise revenue

Health Policy and Analytics: Grants, federal Medicaid reimbursement, fees

Central / Shared Services: Cost allocation

Behavioral Health

Disrupt the Homelessness / Jail / OSH Pipeline

- Restore Non-Medicaid Caseload Decline \$14.2 million GF
- Behavioral Health Crisis Payer Parity \$0.2 million GF
- Case Management for Houseless Patients Discharged from OSH \$6.0 million GF
- Jail Diversion and Enhanced Civil Commitment Services \$14.9 million GF
- Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facilities \$2.3 million GF
- Behavioral Health Coordination Center \$1.5 million GF
- Transition Aged Youth Hubs \$4.1 million GF
- Behavioral Rehabilitation Services Expansion \$4.2 million GF
- Community Acute Psychiatric Capacity Lottery Bonds \$100.0 million OF

Decrease Preventable Deaths

- 988 Line Ramp-Up \$18.4 million GF
- Harm Reduction Clearinghouse \$40.0 million OF
- Suicide Prevention / Intervention Teams \$7.7 million GF
- Child and Adult Substance Use Disorder Facilities \$15.0 million GF

Stabilize, Support and Diversify the Workforce

- Continue 30 percent Medicaid Rate increases into 2023-25 \$127.4 million GF
- Workforce Incentives \$23.2 million GF





Oregon Health Authority 2023-25 Governor's Budget – Investments (cont.)

Medicaid Waiver

- Continuous Eligibility to Age 6 \$39.5 million GF
- 2 Year Continuous Eligibility for 6 and over \$59.8 million GF
- Justice-Involved Populations \$10.4 million GF
- Tribal Enhancements \$0.7 million GF
- Administration and Other \$19.4 million GF
- Health Related Social Needs \$547.0 million FF

Increased Coverage and Access to Care

- Fund Healthier Oregon Program at \$500 million GF
- Projected Caseload Increase after Fall 2022 Caseload \$145.5 million GF
- Essential Worker Healthcare Trust \$10 million GF / \$25 million Total Funds
- Fee-For-Service Dental Rate Increase \$1.5 million GF
- Basic Health Plan Continued Planning \$3.0 million GF

Oregon State Hospital

- Sustainable Staffing Model \$34.5 million GF, 304 positions / 94.63 FTE
- OSH Health Equity Unit \$3.5 million GF
- Complex Case Management Unit \$4.2 million GF
- Response to CMS Review \$4.2 million GF
- Bonding Projects \$8.0 million OF



Oregon Health Authority 2023-25 Governor's Budget – Investments (cont.)

Public Health

- Modernization \$50.0 million GF
- Universally Offered Home Visiting \$5.9 million GF
- Lower Umatilla Basin Groundwater Mitigation \$3.0 million GF
- Protective Equipment and Medical Supply Management \$1.0 million GF
- Contaminated Fish Consumption Study \$1.0 million GF
- Environmental Justice Mapping \$0.2 million GF

Equity Infrastructure and Organizational Capacity

- REALD and SOGI Implementation \$12.7 million GF
- Health Equity Strategic Action Team and Civil Rights / Antiracism Training \$5.0 million GF
- Regional Health Equity Coalition Expansion \$2.1 million GF
- Healthcare Market Oversight \$1.2 million GF
- Mainframe Migration and Client Payment System \$2.0 million GF





Oregon Health Authority 2023-25 Governor's Budget – Savings / Reductions

Medicaid / Oregon Health Plan

- Inflation at 2.4 percent in 2024 and 3.0 percent in 2025 \$66.5 million GF
- Enhanced FMAP for Q1/Q2 2024 \$64.0 million GF
- Lower costs per case and underutilization \$37.9 million GF
- 2023 CCO Rate Savings \$62.7 million GF
- Higher Health Systems Fund Transfer \$34.9 million GF
- Higher CCO Tax Revenues \$34.6 million GF
- Higher Tobacco Master Settlement Revenue \$19.6 million GF
- Higher FF revenues for Base Medicaid program, Cover All Kids, Tribal \$8.4 million GF

Other Programs

- 9-8-8 Charge at \$0.40 per line per month \$37.0 million GF
- Increase Vacancy Rate to 8 percent / 6.2 percent for State Hospital \$34.4 million GF
- S&S Reductions, Vacant Positions, Shared Services Savings \$33.8 million GF
- True Up Residential Investment Ongoing Funding \$27.7 million GF
- Statewide Adjustments for DAS and AG Charges \$5.2 million GF
- All Other Reductions \$4.2 million GF
