Measure Description:

Requires a school district to provide notice of the decision not to give approval within 10 calendar days of receiving notice of the student's intent to enroll in a virtual public charter school. Requires a school district to calculate at least twice each year the school district's percentage of students attending virtual public charter schools not sponsored by the district. Allows students who previously enrolled in virtual public charter school to remain enrolled after moving to another resident district. Requires a school district, if the school district does not give approval, to provide information to the parent or legal guardian of the student about the percentage of students enrolled in virtual public charter schools.
