WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Directs the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) in consultation with the Oregon Conservation and Recreation Advisory Committee to adopt rules to establish a pilot program to provide grants paid out of the Oregon Conservation and Recreation Fund (OCRF) to cities, counties, or nonprofit organizations for projects related to recreational fishing inside an urban growth boundary. Allows for grants to include matching funds for large donations to OCRF under certain conditions. Specifies that matching funds may be paid out of moneys appropriated to OCRF and may exceed the amount of matching funds committed to other projects funded by OCRF. Requires ODFW to submit a report on the implementation of the pilot program to the natural resources-related interim committees of Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2026. Sunsets pilot program and reporting requirements on January 2, 2027.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-4 Replaces the measure. Directs the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) in consultation with the Oregon Conservation and Recreation Advisory Committee to award grants for projects that establish or improve public recreational fishing facilities located within an urban growth boundary and serve to protect, maintain, or enhance fish and wildlife resources in Oregon while considering opportunities to coordinate with the Restoration and Enhancement Board to enhance fishing access. Appropriates \$200,000 General Fund moneys to ODFW. Sunsets January 2, 2026. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

BACKGROUND:

In 2019, the Oregon Legislature passed House Bill 2829 establishing the Oregon Conservation and Recreation Fund (OCRF), along with an associated Advisory Committee to guide expenditures, and directing the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) to use the fund to carry out activities to protect, maintain, or enhance fish and wildlife resources in Oregon.

House Bill 2835 would direct ODFW in consultation with the Advisory Committee to establish a pilot program to award grants for recreational fishing facilities within urban growth boundary and to submit a progress report to the natural resources-related interim committee of Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2026.
