# WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires Oregon Department of Education (ODE) to conduct study to determine impact, cost, and feasibility of implementing Salem-Keizer Threat Assessment System in school districts across state. Requires ODE to submit report to Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2024. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued.

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued.

### **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

## **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

No amendment.

### **BACKGROUND:**

The Salem-Keizer Threat Assessment System is a nationally recognized model for school safety. The <u>district's approach</u> includes multi-tiered systems of support, behavioral threat assessment, and partnerships with law enforcement.

The Student Success Act, <u>House Bill 3427 (2019)</u>, required the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) to establish a Statewide School Safety and Prevention System, which included assistance to school districts and education service districts in implementing a multidisciplinary student safety assessment system. ODE is required to make assessment teams available to assist each school district and education service district.

Washington House Bill 1216 (2019) required the creation of school safety and student well-being programs, including the requirement that school-based threat assessment programs and teams be in place in all law enforcement agencies by the 2020-2021 school year. The state's 2021 School-Based Threat Assessment Fidelity Document notes that education service districts and the Washington Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction adopted the Salem-Keizer Cascade Threat Assessment Model in order to meet the requirements of Washington House Bill 1216 (2019) and RCW 28A.320.123.

House Bill 3348 requires the Oregon Department of Education to study the feasibility, cost, and impact of implementing the Salem-Keizer Threat Assessment System is school districts across the state and to report findings to the legislature by September 15, 2024.
