### Important Issues

- Warehouse Project In 2021-23, OLCC received the authority to sell \$173 million in Article XI-Q bonds to purchase land, design and construct a new warehouse and headquarters, acquire and implement a new information technology system, and acquire and install a new conveyor and order fulfillment system.
  - Land has been purchased
  - RFP evaluations for General Contractor complete, notice of intent to award issued to JE Dunn.
  - Expect fully executed GM/GC contract by end of April 2023.
- Home Delivery Oversight and Enforcement Due to the expansion of internet alcohol sales and shipping nationwide, with the use of 3<sup>rd</sup> party delivery services, OLCC has proposed regulation in order to provide training, permitting and deterring fines related to issues with delivery of alcohol at the doorstep.




- Emerging Issues
  - Governor's budget provides increased investments to enhance OLCC's efforts in maintaining public safety related to the legal sales of alcohol and marijuana in Oregon.





### Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission Expenditure History + 2023-25 Governor's Budget






# Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission Select Alcohol and Marijuana Revenue History

(in millions)






## Agency Budget by Expenditure Category (in millions)

#### Governor's budget actions

- Continue new warehouse IT project funding (\$23.2 million)
- Warehouse and IT non-bondable costs (\$14.4 million)
- Regulatory efforts for alcohol home delivery (\$0.9 million)
- IT Risk Mitigation staffing (\$0.5 million)
- Additional liquor licensing staff (\$0.3 million)
- Marijuana program vehicle replacements (\$0.4 million)
- Staffing in administration for public records requests and financial division (\$0.8 million)
- Improve marijuana lab testing integrity and outreach and communication for Marijuana program (\$1.5 million)
- Eliminate four long-term vacant positions (\$0.7 million)
- Move remaining bond sale for IT project into 2023-25





- Governor's budget actions
  - Assumes additional revenues
    - \$0.50 per bottle surcharge (\$45.2 million)
    - Opening of 10 new liquor stores in 2023-25 (\$10.1 million)
    - Additional revenue associated with alcohol home delivery (\$3.6 million)
