Measure Description:

Creates a defense to the crime of animal abandonment and to the prosecution of theft if the defendant is an animal holding agency, or an employee, volunteer or other agent acting on behalf of the agency. Grants immunity from civil liability to an animal holding agency, or the employee, volunteer or other agent acting on behalf of an animal holding agency, that takes possession of, keeps, or disposes of a cat.
