Measure Description:

Allows marijuana producer, marijuana wholesaler, marijuana processor or marijuana retailer to use motion detection camera system at licensed premises.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on Business and Labor to the House Committee Rules.

The measure includes the following provisions: allows marijuana producers, marijuana wholesalers, marijuana processors, or marijuana retailers to use motion detection camera systems at licensed premises; requires OLCC to issue greenhouse endorsements if applicants meet requirements; establishes a maximum number of licensees relative to population for various license types; allows registered marijuana processors to provide marijuana and related products to medical marijuana cardholders and caregivers; allows licensed processors to use equipment to make products that do not contain cannabinoids; allows OLCC to adopt rules relating to the use of age verification software; and specifies age restrictions on the possession of edibles.

A more complete fiscal analysis on the measure will be prepared as the measure is considered in House Committee on Rules.
