**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:**

Exempts from public record disclosure law certain cybersecurity documents, records, or plans protecting computers, information technology or communications systems from threat or attack.

*FISCAL: No fiscal impact*

*REVENUE: No revenue impact*

*HOUSE VOTE: 57-0-2-1*

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Questions about how sensitive information would be exempted from public records
- Questions about redaction of information versus exemption
- Examples of cybersecurity attacks on local governments

**EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:**

Oregon law provides that every person has a right to inspect any public record of a public body in the state, with some exemptions. Among other exemptions, current exemptions from public record disclosure include personally identifiable information, information related to the Oregon Health Authority, sensitive insurance information.

House Bill 2490 adds language to ORS 192.355 to exempt from public record disclosure cybersecurity documents that protect computer, information technology, or communications systems from threat or attack. This includes records that depend on their effectiveness upon a lack of public knowledge and contractual and insurance records that document cybersecurity specifications.
