Subject:	SB 5546 – Relating to state financial administration Work Session Recommendations

ORS 291.055(1)(e) stipulates that all new state agency fees or fee increases adopted between the date of adjournment sine die of a regular session of the Legislative Assembly and the date of adjournment sine die of the next regular session of the Legislative Assembly, are rescinded upon adjournment sine die of the next regular session of the Legislative Assembly unless the fee is authorized by enabling legislation.

SB 5546 provides the enabling legislation necessary to approve fees adopted through administrative rule by the Oregon Board of Pharmacy during the 2022-23 Interim. New fees adopted include:

- Remote Dispensing Site Pharmacy fee of \$225. This is for locations staffed by a Certified Oregon Pharmacy Technician under supervision of an Oregon license pharmacist via telepharmacy.
- Pharmacy Prescription Locker and Pharmacy Prescription Kiosk fee of \$120. These are for locations that have a system to securely store patient prescriptions and non-prescription items for pickup.

These are new categories of fees within existing registration classifications, and fee levels align with other fees in these classifications. The new fees were driven by the need to offer pharmacy services in underserved areas, and by changes in pharmacy distribution technology.

Since these fees are new the amount of Other Funds revenue that will be received from these new categories is indeterminate but anticipated to be minimal.

Recommended Changes

LFO recommends adoption of the -1 amendment.

Measure Description:

Approves certain new or increased fees adopted by Board of Pharmacy.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Board of Pharmacy

Summary of Fiscal Impact:

Costs related to the measure are anticipated to be minimal - See explanatory analysis.

Analysis:

ORS 291.055(1)(e) stipulates that all new state agency fees or fee increases adopted between the date of adjournment sine die of a regular session of the Legislative Assembly, and the date of adjournment sine die of the next regular session of the Legislative Assembly, are rescinded upon adjournment sine die of the next regular session of the Legislative Assembly unless the fee is authorized by enabling legislation.

This measure provides the enabling legislation necessary to approve fees adopted through administrative rule by the Oregon Board of Pharmacy (OBOP) during the 2022-23 Interim. The new remote dispensing site pharmacy fee is \$225, the new pharmacy prescription lockers fee is \$120, and the new pharmacy prescription kiosk fee is \$120, which align with current registrations and categories. The pharmacy prescription kiosk fee was effective February 2023 and the two retail drug outlet pharmacy categories were effective July 2022.

Due to the minimal revenue impact anticipated, the 2023-25 Legislative Fiscal Office (LFO) Recommended Budget does not assume any additional revenue from the new fee or pharmacy categories included in this measure.
