**Subject:** HB 2645 – Relating to Controlled Substances

Work Session Recommendations

HB 2645-B creates the crime of possession of a Schedule II controlled substance if a person possesses more than one gram, or five or more user units of a mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of fentanyl, or derivative of fentanyl defined by the State Board of Pharmacy as a Class A misdemeanor.

In addition, the measure adds the unit measurements of a mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of fentanyl for purposes of calculating the crime category level when delivering or manufacturing fentanyl. The measure declares an emergency and takes effect upon passage.

A staff measure summary and fiscal impact statement are available on the Oregon Legislative Information System (OLIS). There is no amendment to the measure.
