Subject: HB 2772 – Relating to Domestic Terrorism

Work Session Recommendations

HB 2772A creates the crime of domestic terrorism in first degree, a Class B felony, if a person intentionally destroys or substantially damages critical infrastructure, or intentionally introduces, releases, or disperses a toxic substance into widespread contact with humans.

In addition, the measure creates the crime of domestic terrorism in second degree, a Class C felony, if a person intentionally possesses a toxic substance with the intent to introduce the substance into widespread contact with humans, possesses a destructive device with the intent to destroy or substantially damage critical infrastructure, attempts to destroy or substantially damage critical infrastructure, or attempts to introduce, release or disperse a toxic substance into widespread contact with humans. The measure is effective January 1, 2024.

A staff measure summary and fiscal impact statement are available on the Oregon Legislative Information System (OLIS). There is no amendment to the measure.
