## **COMMISSION ON BLACK AFFAIRS**

The Governor has appointed the following individuals to the Commission on Black Affairs subject to Senate confirmation.<sup>1</sup>

#### **New Appointees**

Mitchell Asemota of Portland Lakayana Drury of Portland LaNicia Duke of Warrenton

#### Terms

Asemota: April 26, 2023 – February 28, 2026 Drury: April 26, 2023 – February 28, 2026 Duke: April 26, 2023 – April 25, 2027

#### **Appointment/Confirmation Authority**

ORS 185.420 (2021)

#### Statement of Economic Interest<sup>2</sup>

Not required.

#### **Statutory Requirements**<sup>3</sup>

The commission is comprised of 11 members:<sup>4</sup>

- one Senator appointed by the President of the Senate (MANNING);
- one Representative appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives (NELSON); and
- nine members appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate (ASEMOTA, BAILEY, BOOKER, DOGO, DRURY, DUKE, DUNCAN, FOUTHER-BRANCH, PRICE).

All members must be Oregon residents. Gubernatorial appointees serve four-year terms; legislators serve two-year terms. Commission members must elect a chairperson and vice chairperson. A majority of members constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. Appointments must be made to ensure representation of black persons in Oregon.

#### **Duties and Authority**

The commission was created to work for the implementation and establishment of economic, social, legal, and political equality for black persons in Oregon.<sup>5</sup>

The commission must:6

- monitor existing programs and legislation designed to meet the needs of Oregon's black population;
- identify and research problem areas and issues affecting the black community and recommend actions to the Governor and the Legislative Assembly, including recommendations on legislative programs;
- maintain a liaison between the black community and government entities;
- encourage black representation on state boards and commissions; and
- meet at least annually in a joint meeting with other commissions to consider and act upon issues of mutual importance.
