

SUBCOMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

HB 2052

Relating to registration of business entities that qualify as data brokers

House Bill 2052 requires data brokers to register annually with the Department of Consumer and Business Services. The measure prohibits data brokers from collecting, selling, or licensing personal data in Oregon without registration. The bill specifies the application process, exemptions, and imposes civil penalties of up to \$500 per violation, with a maximum penalty of \$10,000 per year.

DCBS will hire one permanent Compliance Specialist 2 and one permanent Program Analyst 2 to implement and staff the program. The existing Nationwide Multi-State Licensing System will be used as the platform for registering data brokers under this measure. Registration fees will be established to fund the administration costs.

The -A4 amendment adds \$393,156 in Other Funds expenditure limitation to support the measure's fiscal impact, which includes the cost of two permanent positions.

The Transportation and Economic Development Subcommittee recommends HB 2052 be amended by the -A4 amendment and be reported out do pass, as amended.
