## **Summary of Revenue Changes**

Senate Bill 488 provides \$118,537 General Fund to the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to review and approve facility plans, sampling plans, and testing and test reports that owners or operators of municipal solid waste incinerators must make available under the provisions of the bill.

## **Summary of Natural Resources Subcommittee Action**

Senate Bill 488 requires owners or operators of municipal solid waste incinerators to develop a plan to continuously monitor or sample certain emissions. Plans created under the authority of the bill must provide for the use of a continuous emissions monitoring system when technologically feasible, must describe how continuous monitoring or sampling will be conducted for 12 consecutive months, and must make emissions data available to DEQ and the public. Plans must be submitted within three months after the effective date of the measure. DEQ may make modifications to the plan to ensure quality and accurate sampling or monitoring data. Within three months after approval, the plan must be implemented. DEQ is to report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the environment by September 15, 2024, on monitoring progress, including data received. No later than three months after the completion of the 12-month period of continuous monitoring or sampling, DEQ is also to submit a report to the committees or interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the environment on the results of the monitoring or sampling.

The Subcommittee recommended a General Fund appropriation of \$118,537 to establish one limited duration part-time position (0.44 FTE) to allow DEQ to review the facility plans, sampling plans, and test reports, and to observe testing.
