Work Session Recommendations

This measure creates a process by which a person convicted or found guilty except for insanity by a nonunanimous jury verdict may file a petition for post-conviction relief until two years after the Oregon Supreme Court's ruling in Watkins v. Ackley (December 2022), among other key provisions of the measure. The measure declares an emergency and is effective on passage.

A preliminary staff measure summary, fiscal impact statement, and revenue impact statement are available on the Oregon Legislative Information System (OLIS). There is also a budget amendment on OLIS that removes the special purpose appropriation to the Emergency Board.
