OREGONSERVES COMMISSION

The Governor has appointed the following individuals to the OregonServes Commission subject to Senate confirmation.¹

Statement of Economic Interest²

Not required.

Statutory Requirements³

The commission consists of at least 15 and not more than 25 members appointed by the Governor and subject to confirmation by the Senate. The term of office for each member appointed is three years, but members serve at the pleasure of the Governor.⁴

The members of the commission must be residents of this state who have a proven commitment to community service and who have a demonstrated interest in fostering and nurturing civic engagement as a strategy for strengthening communities and promoting the ethic of service in all sectors of this state. An individual member may represent more than one of the entities or organizations required to be represented.⁵

Membership must include:⁶

- an individual with experience in educational, training and development needs of youth, particularly disadvantaged youth (CRUZ);
- an individual with experience in promoting involvement of adults 55 years of age or older in service and volunteerism (BASS);
- a representative of community-based agencies or organizations within this state (VACANT);
- the Deputy Superintendent of Public Instruction or designee (VACANT);
- a representative of local governments in this state (MCAFEE);
- a representative of local labor unions in this state (EDWARDS);
- a representative of business (VACANT);
- an individual between 16 and 25 years of age who is a participant in or supervisor of a national service program for school-age youth, or a campus-based or national service program (ALTAMIRANO);
- a representative of a national service program (CARPINELLO); and
- a representative of the volunteer sector (PALSHIKAR).

Membership may also include individuals from the following groups:⁷

- educators, including a representative from a post-secondary institution of education and local education agencies (JONES, VILLEGAS);
- experts in the delivery of human, educational, environmental, or public safety services to communities and individuals (BARNES, **CUMBERBATCH-CORPAS**, PRUCH, **RIX**, and SNEAD);
- members or representatives of Native American tribes (VACANT);
- at-risk youths or out-of-school youths (VACANT); and
- entities that receive assistance under the Domestic Volunteer Service Act of 1973 (VACANT).

In making appointments of members, the Governor shall ensure that no more than 50 percent of the appointed members are from the same political party and no more than 25 percent of the appointed members are state employees. To the extent possible, the Governor shall ensure that membership is diverse with respect to race, ethnicity, age, gender, and disability characteristics.⁸

The commission must select a commission member as chairperson and another as vice chairperson, for terms, and with duties and powers necessary for the performance of the functions of those offices, as the commission determines. A majority of the members

of the commission constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. The commission must meet at least once every three months and at the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the commission.⁹

Duties and Authority

The Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) is the federal agency that leads service, volunteering, and grant-making efforts in the United States under the AmeriCorps and Senior Corps programs.¹⁰ States that establish a Service Commission are eligible to receive grants through those programs. The commission is responsible for developing a comprehensive national service plan and administering national and community service programs in the state.¹¹

The commission must:¹²

- develop programs and provide oversight and administration of programs granted to this state by AmeriCorps under the National and Community Service Trust Act of 1993;
- prepare state applications to AmeriCorps for financial assistance for state-based service programs;
- establish priorities for volunteerism and develop a three-year, comprehensive national and community service plan;
- coordinate national service and volunteer service in statewide activities for disaster preparedness, response and relief activities and climate mitigation;
- promote engagement in volunteerism and service for the purpose of strengthening communities in Oregon; and
- biennially submit a report to the Governor and the Legislative Assembly which: details commission activities during the preceding two years; reviews and summarizes the content of reports accepted by the commission on behalf of the Governor; assesses the state of national service in Oregon; and contains specific recommendations for any additional legislation the commission deems necessary to carry out the purpose of the Oregon Volunteer and Community Service Act or to improve the effectiveness or efficiency of the commission.

- apply for and accept grants, contributions and assistance from any federal, state or local government agency and any foundation, individual, or organization.¹⁴
