SUBCOMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

HB 2574 Relating to post-exposure prophylaxes

HB 2574 requires hospitals to adopt policies and procedures to dispense a five-day supply of human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) post-exposure prophylactic (PEP) drugs or therapies following an individual's exposure to HIV.

The Oregon Health Authority is directed to provide each Type A or Type B hospital with a 30-day supply of HIV PEP drugs or therapies once each calendar year. Hospitals are not obligated to accept this supply.

The -A8 amendment includes \$259,052 General Fund, of which \$166,028 is for HIV PEP drugs and the remainder repurposes two existing positions to oversee, evaluate and coordinate access to HIV PEP drugs.

The Human Services Subcommittee recommends HB 2574 be amended by the -A8 amendment and be reported out do pass, as amended.
