House Bills		
HB 2002 C	The bill gives people the right to make decisions about their own reproductive health. It also makes more clear ages of consent for health care services. The bill expands access to reproductive health care in the state with a focus on youth and rural parts. The bill makes health insurance companies cover care and services that affirm a person's gender. It also helps providers of abortion and gender-affirming health care services be protected from court action as a result of providing health care services that are legal.	60.8
HB 2005 C	The bill makes it illegal for an individual to own a firearm that has no metal parts. The bill would also make it illegal to own a firearm or firearm part that does not have a serial number. The bill gives an owner one year to have their firearm or firearm parts serialized.	70.1
