Measure Description:

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Housing and Community Services Department to provide services and assistance to school-aged children experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessness.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Housing and Community Services Department, Oregon Health Authority, Department of Human Services, Department of Early Learning and Care

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on Early Childhood and Human Services to the House Committee on Housing and Homelessness.

The measure appropriates an unspecified amount of money from the General Fund to the Housing and Community Services Department to provide services and aid to K-12 children and their families who are or are at risk of becoming homeless. Additionally, the measure appropriates \$12.5 million to Department of Human Services (DHS) to award grants for increasing homeless youth’s access to shelter facilities, outreach, culturally specific services and mental health or substance abuse services. Another \$12.5 million is appropriated to DHS to award grants for host home projects for youth experiencing homelessness.

A more complete fiscal analysis on the measure will be prepared as the measure is considered in the House Committee on Housing and Homelessness.
