FISCAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

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Measure Description:

Revises definitions related to pharmacy for consistency with applicable federal law.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Department of Consumer and Business Services, Board of Pharmacy

Summary of Fiscal Impact:

Costs related to the measure are anticipated to be minimal - See explanatory analysis.

Analysis:

SB 970 updates and adds definitions relating to pharmacy to align Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) with the Federal Drug Supply Chain Security Act (DSCSA) that becomes operative November 26, 2023. The measure is effective the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

The measure has minimal fiscal impact to the Oregon Board of Pharmacy (OBOP). However, as the measure no longer requires the board to register itinerant vendors or shopkeepers (also known as brokers), OBOP anticipates a revenue decrease of \$21,600 Other Funds.

The measure has no fiscal impact on the Department of Consumer and Business Services.

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
