Measure: HB 3220 - A

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SUMMARY

Modifies provisions of electronics recycling program. Expands definition of covered electronic device. Establishes criteria for electronics producer responsibility programs. Repeals requirement that Department of Environmental Quality establish state contractor program. Repeals requirement that department make certain calculations used in administration of program.

Directs Environmental Quality Commission to establish fee calculated to cover costs to department of carrying out program.

Establishes that changes to program become operative on January 1, 2026. Provides transition provisions.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

OPEN GOVERNMENT IMPACT

Legislative Counsel has not adopted standards for drafting measures that establish exemptions from disclosure of public records.

This measure prohibits the public disclosure of trade secrets and information protected by a trademark or patent that the Department of Environmental Quality receives from an electronics manufacturer or an electronics producer responsibility organization to verify compliance with the electronics producer responsibility program.

If those public records that could be subject to public disclosure were instead subject to mandatory disclosure under public records law, the public could receive trade secrets and information protected by a trademark or patent of electronics manufacturers.
