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Measure Description:

Expands definition of "civil disorder" for purposes of crime of unlawful paramilitary activity.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Cities, Counties, Department of Justice, Confederated Tribes of Siletz, Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Indians, Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Indians, Higher Education Coordinating Commission, Office of the Governor, Oregon Military Department, Special Districts Association of Oregon, Department of Fish and Wildlife, Burns Paiute Tribe, Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde, Confederated Tribes of Umatilla Indian Reservation, Coquille Indian Tribe, Department of State Police, Klamath Tribes, Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission, School Districts, Judicial Department

Analysis:

The measure allows a person injured by another person, or group of persons engaging in paramilitary activity to bring a civil action against the other person or group of persons, individually or jointly. The measure authorizes the Attorney General to initiate a civil action for injunctive relief in the appropriate court if there is reasonable cause that any person or group of persons have engaged in or is about to engage in paramilitary activity.

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on Judiciary to the House Committee on Rules.

A more complete fiscal analysis on the measure will be prepared as the measure is considered in the House Committee on Rules.
