Analysis:

HB 2835 - A directs the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW), in consultation with the Oregon Conservation and Recreation Advisory Committee, to award grants to establish or improve public facilities for recreational fishing inside an urban growth boundary. Grants are to be paid out of the Oregon Conservation and Recreation Fund; the measure appropriates \$200,000 General Fund to ODFW for deposit in the fund, for the purpose of awarding grants. The measure takes on the 91st day after the Legislature adjourns sine die, and the direction to award grants sunsets January 2, 2026.

ODFW anticipates that there would be minimal fiscal impact to implement the new grant program, with existing staff using some of their time for this program. The General Fund appropriated by this measure will need to be deposited in the Oregon Conservation and Recreation Fund, and ODFW will need Other Funds expenditure limitation to disburse the moneys from the Fund, which is reflected in the table above.

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
