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Measure Description:

Increases number of members of Higher Education Coordinating Commission representing congressional districts from five to six and decreases number of members of commission representing the general public from four to three. Adds federally recognized Indian tribes to the list of entities eligible to receive grants under the Oregon Conservation Corps Program. Adds career pathways to goals of Access to Student Assistance Programs in Reach of Everyone (ASPIRE) within the Higher Education Coordinating Commission. Expands the definition of diploma mill and authorizes the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to terminate enrollment of Oregon students in diploma mills operating in or from Oregon.
