Measure Description:

Prohibits person under 21 years of age from possessing firearms with specified exceptions.

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on Judiciary to the House Committee on Rules.

The measure increases the age restriction for the current crime of unlawful possession of a firearm, a Class A misdemeanor, from 18 to 21. The measure is effective on January 1, 2024.
