Measure Description:

Directs Criminal Justice Commission to study professional and occupational licensing.

Analysis:

SB 763 - MRA directs the Criminal Justice Commission (CJC) to study whether undergoing adjudication as a youth for a criminal act affects a person’s later occupational or professional behavior, and the extent, if any, of correlation between adjudication and later behavior that violates standards for professional and occupational licensing. CJC is to submit a report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to occupational licensing no later than September 15, 2024. The measure takes effect January 1, 2024 and is repealed on January 2, 2025.

CJC anticipates needing one limited duration, full time Research Analyst 3 (0.50 FTE in the 2023-25 biennium) to conduct the research required, at a total cost of \$110,827 General Fund. This includes \$99,633 for personal services and \$11,194 for services and supplies. This position is priced with a start date of January 1, 2024 and a phase out date of January 1, 2025, given the effective and repeal dates of the measure. However, CJC notes that it will be difficult to complete the report required by September if the position starts in January.

This measure warrants a subsequent referral to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means for consideration of its budgetary impact.
