WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Prohibits wagering on greyhound racing. Allows Multi-Jurisdictional Simulcasting and Interactive Wagering Totalizator Hub licensees (Hubs) to accept and facilitate mutuel wagers on greyhound races from persons outside the state. Prohibits Hubs from accepting or facilitating mutuel wagers on greyhound races held at courses in Mexico. Prohibits Hubs from accepting or facilitating any wagers on any greyhound races after July 1, 2029. Adds reporting requirements to existing Oregon Racing Commission annual reports on greyhound race wagers to Legislative Assembly. Makes conforming amendments and removes statutory references to greyhound racing.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- The reinforcement of the intent of Senate Bill 1504 (2022)
- Multi-Jurisdictional Simulcasting and Interactive Wagering Totalizator Hub licensees (Hubs) accepting or facilitating wagers on international greyhound racing

- The Oregon Racing Commission's (ORC) role
- Whether prohibiting Hubs from accepting or facilitating wagers on greyhound racing will harm the ORC's ability to finance horse racing in the future
- The Legislative Assembly's future role in financing horse racing

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

Replaces the measure.

BACKGROUND:

The Oregon Racing Commission (ORC) licenses, regulates, and supervises all race meets in Oregon, and has sole discretion whether a meet is licensed. It has the authority to cooperate with racing commissions or boards in other jurisdictions, and other racing organizations, to enforce laws regulating racing. The ORC is comprised of five members that are appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate.

A Multi-Jurisdictional Simulcasting and Interactive Wagering Totalizator Hub is a business that conducts pari-mutuel wagering on the races that it simulcasts, and other races that it carries in its wagering menu, through a qualified subscriber-based service. Pari-mutuel wagering is a game in which individuals wager on the outcome of a live race. Instead of wagering against a sportsbook, individuals wager against other individuals in a pool. Therefore, the wagers are pooled, and the winnings are shared equally amongst the individuals who placed the winning bets, after the house fees are deducted.

Senate Bill 1504 (2022) prohibited the granting or licensing of greyhound race meets on and after July 1, 2022. It also allowed a Multi-Jurisdictional Simulcasting and Interactive Wagering Totalizator Hub to establish an account

for wagering on greyhound racing for an individual, unless doing so was unlawful in the jurisdiction of the individual's principal residence. This effectively prohibited wagering on greyhound racing, regardless of the state or country in which the wagering occurs, if the individual resides in Oregon.

House Bill 3514 A prohibits wagering on greyhound racing and prohibits Multi-Jurisdictional Simulcasting and Interactive Wagering Totalizator Hub licensees from accepting or facilitating any wagers on any greyhound races after July 1, 2029.
