Measure Description:

Directs the Criminal Justice Commission, in consultation with disability rights advocates, to study the provisions of SB 528 with the -2 amendment.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Summary of Fiscal Impact:

Costs related to the measure are indeterminate at this time - See explanatory analysis.

Analysis:

The measure directs the Criminal Justice Commission (CJC), in consultation with disability rights advocates, to study the provisions of SB 528 with the -2 amendment and submit a report, no later than January 1, 2024, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on specified aspects of the amendment. The measure is effective on the 91st day after sine die and repealed on January 1, 2024.

The fiscal impact for CJC is indeterminate. The measure is effective on the 91st day of sine die and is repealed within three months; therefore, the measure does not provide sufficient time for the Commission to hire, contract, or utilize existing staff to complete the requirements of the measure.

There is a minimal fiscal impact on the Oregon Judicial Department.

There is no fiscal impact on the Oregon Health Authority, Department of Human Services, Public Defense Services Commission, Long Term Care Ombudsman, Department of Justice, District Attorneys, or counties.
