WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Prohibits a gun dealer from transferring a firearm unless 72 hours have elapsed since receipt of the unique approval number from the Department of Oregon State Police (OSP). Provides that a gun dealer is immune from civil liability for any use of the firearm by the recipient or transferee if the gun dealer allows 72 hours to elapse between receipt of the unique approval number and transfer of the firearm. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Senate Bill 348 (2023)

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

Replaces the measure.

BACKGROUND:

Under current law, a gun dealer may transfer a firearm to a transferee if the dealer receives a unique approval number from the Oregon State Police (OSP) and within 48 hours of completing the transfer, the dealer notifies OSP that the transfer has occurred.
