# **Summary of Revenue Changes**

The bill provides \$259,052 General Fund and reduces Other Funds revenues by \$93,023 within the Public Health program to reflect the change of purpose for the positions from their current work to support the purposes of the bill.

# **Summary of Human Services Subcommittee Action**

House Bill 2574 requires hospitals to adopt policies to dispense human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) post-exposure prophylactic (PEP) drugs or therapies following an individual's exposure to HIV to prevent the spread of the disease. Hospitals must adopt procedures to allow their staff to dispense a minimum five-day supply of HIV PEP drugs or therapies with a patient's consent. The bill directs the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to provide Type A and B hospitals with a 30-day supply of HIV PEP drugs at least once each calendar year. The bill prohibits insurers from requiring cost-sharing for five-day supplies of post-exposure HIV drugs or therapies, which applies to health benefit plans issued, renewed, or extended on after January 1, 2024.

The Subcommittee recommended \$259,052 General Fund and reduced \$93,023 Other Funds expenditure limitation to support implementation of the bill. The cost to supply each of Oregon's 33 Type A and B hospitals with sufficient 30-day supplies of HIV PEP drugs once a year beginning on January 1, 2024, is \$166,028 General Fund. This cost is expected to roll up to \$221,370 General Fund in 2025-27.

In addition to the cost of the drugs, the Subcommittee recommended the reduction of \$93,023 Other Funds and an increase of \$93,024 General Fund to administer the new program. This would allow OHA to repurpose an existing Compliance Specialist 3 to implement, oversee, evaluate, coordinate, and monitor activities associated with PEP access and an existing Administrative Specialist 1 position to monitor and track HIV PEP supplies and distribute HIV PEP drugs to hospitals.
