WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Permits a Board of Towing member required to be a chief of police to be either a chief of police or a county sheriff. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

Need for larger pool of potential appointees from law enforcement

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

The Legislative Assembly established the State Board of Towing with the passage of Senate Bill 300 (2021). The nine-member board consists of members appointed by the Governor representing towing companies from both small and large cities; companies that specialize in towing small and large vehicles; the insurance industry; law enforcement; and consumer advocates. Board members are appointed to four-year terms, select their chair and vice-chair from among their own members, and are empowered to appoint an administrative officer.

The two law enforcement slots on the Board are a member from the Oregon State Police tow program and a chief of police. House Bill 3583 allows the second slot to be filled by either a chief of police or a county sheriff.
