## Summary of Revenue Changes

Other Funds revenues to support the bill will come from premiums paid by employers and employees who participate in the Oregon Educators Benefits Board (OEBB).

## Summary of Human Services Subcommittee Action

House Bill 2994 requires health benefit plans to pay for the cost of bilateral cochlear implants, including the fitting of the device, without requiring a deductible. The bill further requires health benefit plans to cover these devices and services regardless of whether they are prescription products or not. Coordinated Care Organizations are required to provide the devices and services described in the measure to medical assistance recipients who are 18 years of age or younger. The coverage requirements established in the measure impact public school and other employee health care coverage provided through plans offered by OEBB and Public Employees' Benefit Board (PEBB), which are included in the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) budget.

The Subcommittee approved $\$ 517,750$ Other Funds expenditure limitation for OEBB to pay for the benefits required under the bill. This translates to an anticipated 0.04 percent premium increase on OEBB's benefit plans due to the benefit plan changes and the removal of the deductible. The fiscal impact on PEBB and the Oregon Health Plan are expected to be minimal.
