House Bill 2701

Sponsored by Representative HUDSON; Representatives EVANS, NELSON, Senator PATTERSON (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Increases retirement benefits and lowers normal retirement age under Oregon Public Service

4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
5	SECTION 1. ORS 238A.005, as amended by section 3, chapter 83, Oregon Laws 2022, is amended
6	to read:
7	238A.005. For the purposes of this chapter:
8	(1) "Active member" means a member of the pension program or the individual account program
9	of the Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan who is actively employed in a qualifying position.
10	(2) "Actuarial equivalent" means a payment or series of payments having the same value as the
11	payment or series of payments replaced, computed on the basis of interest rate and mortality as-
12	sumptions adopted by the board.
13	(3) "Board" means the Public Employees Retirement Board.
14	(4) "Eligible employee" means a person who performs services for a participating public em-
15	ployer, including persons considered employees of a participating public employer under 26 U.S.C.
16	3121(d)(2), as in effect on January 1, 2022, and elected officials other than judges. "Eligible
17	employee" does not include:
18	(a) Persons engaged as independent contractors;
19	(b) Aliens working under a training or educational visa;
20	(c) Persons provided sheltered employment or make-work by a public employer;
21	(d) Persons categorized by a participating public employer as student employees;
22	(e) Any person who is in custody in a state institution;
23	(f) Employees of foreign trade offices of the Oregon Business Development Department who live
24	and perform services in foreign countries under the provisions of ORS 285A.075 (1)(g);
25	(g) An employee actively participating in an alternative retirement program established under
26	ORS 353.250 or an optional retirement plan established under ORS 341.551;
27	(h) Employees of a public university listed in ORS 352.002 who are actively participating in an
28	optional retirement plan offered under ORS 243.815;
29	(i) Persons employed in positions classified as post-doctoral scholar positions by a public uni-
30	versity listed in ORS 352.002, or by the Oregon Health and Science University, under ORS 350.370;
31	(j) Any employee who belongs to a class of employees that was not eligible on August 28, 2003,

1 for membership in the system under the provisions of ORS chapter 238 or other law;

2 (k) Any person who belongs to a class of employees who are not eligible to become members 3 of the Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan under the provisions of ORS 238A.070 (2);

4 (L) Any person who is retired under ORS 238A.100 to 238A.250 or ORS chapter 238 and who 5 continues to receive retirement benefits while employed; and

6 (m) Judges.

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(5) "Firefighter" means:

8 (a) A person employed by a local government, as defined in ORS 174.116, whose primary job 9 duties include the fighting of fires;

10 (b) The State Fire Marshal, the chief deputy state fire marshal and deputy state fire marshals;

(c) An employee of the State Fire Marshal whose primary duties include fire investigation, fire
 prevention, fire safety, fire control or fire suppression;

(d) An employee of the State Forestry Department who is certified by the State Forester as a
 professional wildland firefighter and whose primary duties include the abatement of uncontrolled
 fires as described in ORS 477.064; and

(e) An employee of the Oregon Military Department whose primary duties include fighting
 structural, aircraft, wildland or other fires.

18 (6) "Fund" means the Public Employees Retirement Fund.

19 (7)(a) "Hour of service" means:

20 (A) An hour for which an eligible employee is directly or indirectly paid or entitled to payment 21 by a participating public employer for performance of duties in a qualifying position; and

(B) An hour of vacation, holiday, illness, incapacity, jury duty, military duty or authorized leave during which an employee does not perform duties but for which the employee is directly or indirectly paid or entitled to payment by a participating public employer for services in a qualifying position, as long as the hour is within the number of hours regularly scheduled for the performance of duties during the period of vacation, holiday, illness, incapacity, jury duty, military duty or authorized leave.

(b) "Hour of service" does not include any hour for which payment is made or due under a plan
maintained solely for the purpose of complying with applicable unemployment compensation laws.

(8) "Inactive member" means a member of the pension program or the individual account program of the Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan whose membership has not been terminated, who
is not a retired member and who is not employed in a qualifying position.

(9) "Individual account program" means the defined contribution individual account program of
 the Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan established under ORS 238A.025.

(10) "Institution of higher education" means a public university listed in ORS 352.002, the
 Oregon Health and Science University or a community college, as defined in ORS 341.005.

(11) "Member" means an eligible employee who has established membership in the pension pro gram or the individual account program of the Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan and whose
 membership has not been terminated under ORS 238A.110 or 238A.310.

(12) "Participating public employer" means a public employer as defined in ORS 238.005 that
 provides retirement benefits for employees of the public employer under the system.

42 (13) "Pension program" means the defined benefit pension program of the Oregon Public Service
43 Retirement Plan established under ORS 238A.025.

44 (14) "Police officer" means a police officer as described in ORS 238.005.

45 (15) "Qualifying position" means one or more jobs with one or more participating public em-

1 ployers in which an eligible employee performs 600 or more hours of service in a calendar year,

2 excluding any service in a job for which benefits are not provided under the Oregon Public Service

3 Retirement Plan pursuant to ORS 238A.070 (2).

4 (16) "Retired member" means a pension program member who is receiving a pension as provided 5 in ORS 238A.180 to 238A.195.

6 (17)(a) "Salary" means the remuneration paid to an active member in return for services to the 7 participating public employer, including remuneration in the form of living quarters, board or other 8 items of value, to the extent the remuneration is, or would be if the member were an Oregon resi-9 dent, includable in the employee's taxable income under Oregon law. "Salary" includes the addi-10 tional amounts specified in paragraph (b) of this subsection, but does not include the amounts 11 specified in paragraph (c) of this subsection, regardless of whether those amounts are includable in 12 taxable income.

13 (b) "Salary" includes the following amounts:

(A) Payments of employee and employer money into a deferred compensation plan that are madeat the election of the employee.

(B) Contributions to a tax-sheltered or deferred annuity that are made at the election of theemployee.

18 (C) Any amount that is contributed to a cafeteria plan or qualified transportation fringe benefit 19 plan by the employer at the election of the employee and that is not includable in the taxable in-20 come of the employee by reason of 26 U.S.C. 125 or 132(f)(4), as in effect on December 31, 2021.

(D) Any amount that is contributed to a cash or deferred arrangement by the employer at the election of the employee and that is not included in the taxable income of the employee by reason of 26 U.S.C. 402(e)(3), as in effect on December 31, 2021.

24 (E) Retroactive payments described in ORS 238.008.

(F) The amount of an employee contribution to the individual account program that is paid by
the employer and deducted from the compensation of the employee, as provided under ORS 238A.335
(1) and (2)(a).

(G) The amount of an employee contribution to the individual account program that is not paid
by the employer under ORS 238A.335.

(H) Wages of a deceased member paid to a surviving spouse or dependent children under ORS
 652.190.

32 (c) "Salary" does not include the following amounts:

(A) Travel or any other expenses incidental to employer's business which is reimbursed by theemployer.

(B) Payments made on account of an employee's death.

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36 (C) Any lump sum payment for accumulated unused sick leave, vacation leave or other paid
 37 leave.

(D) Any severance payment, accelerated payment of an employment contract for a future periodor advance against future wages.

40 (E) Any retirement incentive, retirement bonus or retirement gratuitous payment.

(F) Payment for a leave of absence after the date the employer and employee have agreed thatno future services in a qualifying position will be performed.

43 (G) Payments for instructional services rendered to public universities listed in ORS 352.002 or
44 the Oregon Health and Science University when those services are in excess of full-time employment
45 subject to this chapter. A person employed under a contract for less than 12 months is subject to

this subparagraph only for the months covered by the contract. 1

2 (H) The amount of an employee contribution to the individual account program that is paid by the employer and is not deducted from the compensation of the employee, as provided under ORS 3 238A.335 (1) and (2)(b). 4

 $\mathbf{5}$ (I) Compensation described and authorized under ORS 341.556 that is not paid by the community college employing the faculty member. 6

(J) Compensation described and authorized under ORS 352.232 that is not paid by the public 7 university employing the officer or employee. 8

9 (K) Compensation described and authorized under ORS 353.270 that is not paid by Oregon 10 Health and Science University.

(L) For years before 2020, any amount in excess of \$200,000 for a calendar year. If any period 11 12 over which salary is determined is less than 12 months, the \$200,000 limitation for that period shall 13 be multiplied by a fraction, the numerator of which is the number of months in the determination period and the denominator of which is 12. The board shall adopt rules adjusting this dollar limit 14 15 to incorporate cost-of-living adjustments authorized by the Internal Revenue Service.

16 (M) For years beginning on or after January 1, 2020, any amount in excess of \$195,000 for a calendar year. If any period over which salary is determined is less than 12 months, the \$195,000 17 18 limitation for that period shall be multiplied by a fraction, the numerator of which is the number of months in the determination period and the denominator of which is 12. On January 1 of each 19 year, the board shall adjust the dollar limit provided by this subparagraph to reflect any percentage 20changes in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, West Region (All Items), as pub-2122lished by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor.

(a) Payments made under ORS chapter 656; or 26

27(b) Payments provided in lieu of workers' compensation benefits under ORS 656.027 (6).

SECTION 2. ORS 238A.125, as amended by section 4, chapter 83, Oregon Laws 2022, is amended 2829to read:

30 238A.125. (1) Upon retiring at normal retirement age, a vested pension program member shall 31 be paid an annual pension for the life of the member as follows:

(a) For service as a police officer, [or] firefighter, telecommunicator or employee of the 32Oregon State Hospital, 1.8 percent of final average salary multiplied by the number of years of 33 34 retirement credit attributable to service as a police officer, [or] firefighter, telecommunicator or 35 employee of the Oregon State Hospital.

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(b) For service as other than a police officer, [or] firefighter, telecommunicator or employee 37 of the Oregon State Hospital, 1.5 percent of final average salary multiplied by the number of years 38 of retirement credit attributable to service as other than a police officer, [or] firefighter, telecommunicator or employee of the Oregon State Hospital. 39

40 (2) Notwithstanding any provision of ORS 238A.100 to 238A.250, the annual benefit payable to a member under the pension program and under any other tax-qualified defined benefit plan main-41 tained by the participating public employer may not exceed the applicable limitations set forth in 4226 U.S.C. 415(b), as in effect on December 31, 2021. The Public Employees Retirement Board shall 43 adopt rules for the administration of this limitation, including adjustments in the annual dollar lim-44 itation to reflect cost-of-living adjustments authorized by the Internal Revenue Service. 45

3	SECTION 3. ORS 238A.160 is amended to read:
4	238A.160. (1) Except as provided in subsections (2) [and (3)] to (4) of this section, normal re-
5	tirement age for a member of the pension program is the earlier of:
6	(a) 65 years of age; or
7	(b) 58 years of age if the member has 30 years or more of retirement credit.
8	(2) Normal retirement age for a member of the pension program who retires from service as a
9	police officer or firefighter, and who has held a position as a police officer or firefighter contin-
10	uously for a period of not less than five years immediately preceding the effective date of retirement,
11	is the earlier of:
12	(a) 60 years of age; or
13	(b) 53 years of age if the member has 25 years or more of retirement credit.
14	(3) Normal retirement age for a member of the pension program who retires from service as a
15	school employee as defined by ORS 238A.140 is the earlier of:
16	(a) 65 years of age; or
17	(b) 58 years of age if the member has been an active member in 30 or more calendar years.
18	(4)(a) Normal retirement age for a member of the pension program who retires from

29	SECTION 4. ORS 238A.165 is amended to read:
30	238A.165. (1) Except as provided in this section, earliest retirement age for a member of the
31	pension program is 55 years of age.
32	(2) Earliest retirement age for a member of the pension program who retires from service as a
33	police officer or firefighter is 50 years of age if the member has held a position as a police officer
34	or firefighter continuously for a period of not less than five years immediately before the effective
35	date of retirement. Earliest retirement date for a member described in this subsection is not later
36	than the date the member reaches 55 years of age.
37	(3) If a member of the pension program has 25 years or more of retirement credit as a
38	telecommunicator[, as defined in ORS 181A.355], earliest retirement age for the member is 55 years

1 **SECTION 5.** ORS 238A.220 is amended to read:

2 238A.220. (1) A participating public employer shall make employer contributions to the Public 3 Employees Retirement Board at intervals designated by the board in the amounts determined by the 4 board under ORS 238.225. All participating public employers shall be considered to be a single em-5 ployer for the purposes of the employer contributions under ORS 238.225 that are required for 6 funding the pension program established under ORS 238A.025.

7 (2) For the purpose of the actuarial computation required under ORS 238.225, the board shall 8 separately establish the liability of participating public employers for police officers, [and] fire-9 fighters, telecommunicators and employees of the Oregon State Hospital under the pension 10 program and shall require that public employers that employ police officers, [and] firefighters, 11 telecommunicators and employees of the Oregon State Hospital who are members of the pen-12 sion program make contributions for those employees based on the liability established under this 13 subsection.

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SECTION 6. ORS 238A.240 is amended to read:

15 238A.240. (1) A participating public employer shall contribute to the pension program, at intervals designated by the Public Employees Retirement Board, all amounts determined by the board to 16 be actuarially necessary to adequately fund the disability benefits to be provided under ORS 17 18 238A.235 and the reasonable costs of administering the provision of those benefits. The board shall periodically determine the liabilities attributable to the disability benefits and shall set the amount 19 of contributions to be made by participating public employers, and by other public employers who 20are required to make contributions on behalf of members, to ensure that those liabilities will be 2122funded no more than 40 years after the date on which the determination is made. All participating 23public employers shall be considered to be a single employer for the purposes of the contributions required under this section. 24

(2) For the purpose of the actuarial computation required under subsection (1) of this section, the board shall separately establish the liability of participating public employers for police officers, [and] firefighters, telecommunicators and employees of the Oregon State Hospital, and shall require that public employers that employ police officers, [and] firefighters, telecommunicators and employees of the Oregon State Hospital make contributions for those employees based on the liability established under this section.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) The amendments to ORS 238A.005, 238A.125, 238A.160, 238A.165, 238A.220 and 238A.240 by sections 1 to 6 of this 2023 Act apply only to a person who is employed as a telecommunicator or as an employee of the Oregon State Hospital on or after the effective date of this 2023 Act.

(2) The amendments to ORS 238A.125 by section 2 of this 2023 Act apply only to service
 as a telecommunicator or as an employee of the Oregon State Hospital performed on or after
 the effective date of this 2023 Act.

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
