House Bill 2715

Sponsored by Representative SCHARF, Senator HANSELL; Representatives DIEHL, LEVY B, MORGAN, WRIGHT, Senators DEMBROW, FINDLEY, PATTERSON, THATCHER (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Prohibits health insurers and pharmacy benefit managers from restricting coverage of physician-administered prescription drugs that are obtained by nonparticipating pharmacies. Designates violation of prohibition as unlawful practice.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to insurance coverage of prescription drugs; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 646.608 and 735.533.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2023 Act is added to and made a part of the Insurance Code.
- 6 SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section:

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- (a) "Participating pharmacy" means a pharmacy or pharmacist that:
- (A) Contracts with an insurer or a pharmacy benefit manager to provide prescription drugs to enrollees in policies or certificates of health insurance issued by the insurer or administered by the pharmacy benefit manager; or
 - (B) Is under the ownership or control of an insurer or pharmacy benefit manager.
- (b) "Participating provider" means a health care provider that contracts with an insurer or a pharmacy benefit manager to provide health care items or services to enrollees in policies or certificates of health insurance issued by the insurer or administered by the pharmacy benefit manager and any clinic, hospital outpatient department or pharmacy under the common ownership or control of the health care provider.
- (c) "Physician-administered drug" means a prescription drug, other than a vaccine, that requires administration by a health professional and is not approved for self-administration.
- (2) An insurer offering a policy or certificate of health insurance in this state that reimburses the cost of prescription drugs or a pharmacy benefit manager registered in this state may not deny or in any way restrict the coverage of a physician-administered drug that is obtained by a participating provider from a pharmacy that is not a participating pharmacy if the drug:
 - (a) Is a covered prescription drug under the terms of the policy, certificate or contract;
 - (b) Is medically necessary; and
- 26 (c) Meets supply chain security controls and chain of distribution requirements of federal law.
 - (3) An insurer or pharmacy benefit manager restricts the coverage of a drug under subsection (2) of this section if the insurer or pharmacy benefit manager:
 - (a) Refuses to authorize coverage of the drug;

- (b) Imposes a restriction or condition on the coverage that does not apply to prescription drugs obtained by the participating provider from a participating pharmacy;
- (c) Pays less reimbursement than the reimbursement paid for the drug when obtained by the participating provider from a participating pharmacy; or
- (d) Imposes higher copayments or other out-of-pocket costs on enrollees receiving the drug from a participating provider than are imposed when the participating provider administers the same drug obtained from a participating pharmacy.
- (4) Medical necessity criteria for coverage of a physician-administered drug may not be based, in whole or in part, on the location of the health care provider administering the drug.
- (5) This section does not prohibit an insurer from establishing, for enrollees, centers of excellence based on nationally recognized, objective quality measures that are centered on specific drug treatments and designed to improve the safety, quality, affordability and expertise in the administration of the treatment.
- (6) Any contract provision that is contrary to the provisions of this section or that purports to waive the provisions of this section is void and unenforceable.
 - (7) Violation of this section is an unlawful practice under ORS 646.608.
 - SECTION 3. ORS 646.608 is amended to read:

- 646.608. (1) A person engages in an unlawful practice if in the course of the person's business, vocation or occupation the person does any of the following:
 - (a) Passes off real estate, goods or services as the real estate, goods or services of another.
- (b) Causes likelihood of confusion or of misunderstanding as to the source, sponsorship, approval, or certification of real estate, goods or services.
- (c) Causes likelihood of confusion or of misunderstanding as to affiliation, connection, or association with, or certification by, another.
- (d) Uses deceptive representations or designations of geographic origin in connection with real estate, goods or services.
- (e) Represents that real estate, goods or services have sponsorship, approval, characteristics, ingredients, uses, benefits, quantities or qualities that the real estate, goods or services do not have or that a person has a sponsorship, approval, status, qualification, affiliation, or connection that the person does not have.
- (f) Represents that real estate or goods are original or new if the real estate or goods are deteriorated, altered, reconditioned, reclaimed, used or secondhand.
- (g) Represents that real estate, goods or services are of a particular standard, quality, or grade, or that real estate or goods are of a particular style or model, if the real estate, goods or services are of another.
- (h) Disparages the real estate, goods, services, property or business of a customer or another by false or misleading representations of fact.
- (i) Advertises real estate, goods or services with intent not to provide the real estate, goods or services as advertised, or with intent not to supply reasonably expectable public demand, unless the advertisement discloses a limitation of quantity.
- (j) Makes false or misleading representations of fact concerning the reasons for, existence of, or amounts of price reductions.
- (k) Makes false or misleading representations concerning credit availability or the nature of the transaction or obligation incurred.
 - (L) Makes false or misleading representations relating to commissions or other compensation to

- be paid in exchange for permitting real estate, goods or services to be used for model or demonstration purposes or in exchange for submitting names of potential customers.
- (m) Performs service on or dismantles any goods or real estate if the owner or apparent owner of the goods or real estate does not authorize the service or dismantling.
- (n) Solicits potential customers by telephone or door to door as a seller unless the person provides the information required under ORS 646.611.
- (o) In a sale, rental or other disposition of real estate, goods or services, gives or offers to give a rebate or discount or otherwise pays or offers to pay value to the customer in consideration of the customer giving to the person the names of prospective purchasers, lessees, or borrowers, or otherwise aiding the person in making a sale, lease, or loan to another person, if earning the rebate, discount or other value is contingent upon an event occurring after the time the customer enters into the transaction.
- (p) Makes any false or misleading statement about a prize, contest or promotion used to publicize a product, business or service.
- (q) Promises to deliver real estate, goods or services within a certain period of time with intent not to deliver the real estate, goods or services as promised.
 - (r) Organizes or induces or attempts to induce membership in a pyramid club.
- (s) Makes false or misleading representations of fact concerning the offering price of, or the person's cost for real estate, goods or services.
- (t) Concurrent with tender or delivery of any real estate, goods or services fails to disclose any known material defect or material nonconformity.
 - (u) Engages in any other unfair or deceptive conduct in trade or commerce.
- (v) Violates any of the provisions relating to auction sales, consignment sales, auctioneers, consignees or auction marts under ORS 698.640, whether in a commercial or noncommercial situation.
 - (w) Manufactures mercury fever thermometers.
- (x) Sells or supplies mercury fever thermometers unless the thermometer is required by federal law, or is:
 - (A) Prescribed by a person licensed under ORS chapter 677; and
- (B) Supplied with instructions on the careful handling of the thermometer to avoid breakage and on the proper cleanup of mercury should breakage occur.
- (y) Sells a thermostat that contains mercury unless the thermostat is labeled in a manner to inform the purchaser that mercury is present in the thermostat and that the thermostat may not be disposed of until the mercury is removed, reused, recycled or otherwise managed to ensure that the mercury does not become part of the solid waste stream or wastewater. For purposes of this paragraph, "thermostat" means a device commonly used to sense and, through electrical communication with heating, cooling or ventilation equipment, control room temperature.
- (z) Sells or offers for sale a motor vehicle manufactured after January 1, 2006, that contains mercury light switches.

- (2) A representation under subsection (1) of this section or ORS 646.607 may be any manifestation of any assertion by words or conduct, including, but not limited to, a failure to disclose a fact.
- (3) In order to prevail in an action or suit under ORS 336.184 and 646.605 to 646.652, a prosecuting attorney need not prove competition between the parties or actual confusion or misunderstanding.
- (4) An action or suit may not be brought under subsection (1)(u) of this section unless the Attorney General has first established a rule in accordance with the provisions of ORS chapter 183 declaring the conduct to be unfair or deceptive in trade or commerce.
- (5) Notwithstanding any other provision of ORS 336.184 and 646.605 to 646.652, if an action or suit is brought under subsection (1)(xx) of this section by a person other than a prosecuting attorney, relief is limited to an injunction and the prevailing party may be awarded reasonable attorney fees.

SECTION 4. ORS 735.533 is amended to read:

- 735.533. (1) In accordance with ORS chapter 183, the Department of Consumer and Business Services may deny an application for registration as a pharmacy benefit manager or an application for renewal of a registration as a pharmacy benefit manager, and may suspend or revoke a registration as a pharmacy benefit manager, if the department finds that an applicant or registrant:
- (a) Falsified an application for registration or for the renewal of a registration or engaged in any dishonest act in relation to the application;
- (b) Engaged in dishonesty, fraud or gross negligence in the conduct of business as a pharmacy benefit manager;
- (c) Engaged in conduct that resulted in a conviction of a felony under the laws of any state or of the United States, to the extent that such conduct may be considered under ORS 670.280;
- (d) Was convicted under the laws of any state or of the United States of any crime of which an essential element is dishonesty or fraud;
- (e) Had a certificate of authority or authority to conduct business as a pharmacy benefit manager denied, revoked or suspended in another state;
- (f) Failed to pay a civil penalty imposed by final order of the department or to comply with the terms of suspension set by the department;
- (g) Failed to meet the terms of a consent decree approved by a court of competent jurisdiction in this state, or a consent order made between the department and the pharmacy benefit manager;
- (h) Refused to be examined or to produce accounts, records or files for examination, including the refusal by any officer of the applicant or registrant to give information with respect to the affairs of the pharmacy benefit manager, or refused to perform any other legal obligation with respect to an examination by the department; or
 - (i) Violated any rule or order of the department or any provision of the Insurance Code, in-

cluding but not limited to section 2 of this 2023 Act.

(2) The department may prescribe by rule a procedure by which a pharmacy or an entity acting on behalf of a pharmacy may file a complaint with the department alleging that a pharmacy benefit manager has engaged in conduct described in this section. The department may restrict the right of a pharmacy or entity to file a complaint only to the extent necessary to prevent abuse of the complaint process.
