SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure

Establishes Oregon Public Assistance Grant Account as account in Oregon Disaster Response Fund. Continuously appropriates moneys in account to Oregon Department of Emergency Management for funding to state agencies, local governments, special government bodies, federally recog-nized Indian tribes and nonprofit organizations for specified emergency response activities. Establishes Oregon Individual Assistance Grant Account as account in Oregon Disaster

Response Fund. Continuously appropriates moneys in account to department for assistance to individuals and households following emergencies.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to emergency management; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 401.025, 401.534 $\mathbf{2}$ and 401.536.

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Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

SECTION 1. ORS 401.025 is amended to read:

401.025. As used in this chapter: 6

(1) "Emergency" means a human created or natural event or circumstance that causes or 7 threatens widespread loss of life, injury to person or property, human suffering or financial loss, 8 including but not limited to: 9

10 (a) Fire, wildfire, explosion, flood, severe weather, landslides or mud slides, drought, earthquake, volcanic activity, tsunamis or other oceanic phenomena, spills or releases of oil or hazardous mate-11 12rial as defined in ORS 466.605, contamination, utility or transportation emergencies, disease, blight, infestation, civil disturbance, riot, sabotage, acts of terrorism and war; and 13

(b) A rapid influx of individuals from outside this state, a rapid migration of individuals from 14 one part of this state to another or a rapid displacement of individuals if the influx, migration or 15 displacement results from the type of event or circumstance described in paragraph (a) of this sub-16 17 section.

(2) "Emergency service agency" means an organization within a local government that performs 18 essential services for the public's benefit before, during or after an emergency, such as law 19 enforcement, fire control, health, medical and sanitation services, public works and engineering, 20public information and communications. 21

22(3) "Emergency services" means activities engaged in by state and local government agencies 23to prepare for an emergency and to prevent, minimize, respond to or recover from an emergency, including but not limited to coordination, preparedness planning, training, interagency liaison, fire 24fighting, oil or hazardous material spill or release cleanup as defined in ORS 466.605, law enforce-25

ment, medical, health and sanitation services, engineering and public works, search and rescue ac-1 2 tivities, warning and public information, damage assessment[,] and administration and fiscal management[, and those measures defined as "civil defense" in 50 U.S.C. app. 2252]. 3 (4) "Local government" has the meaning given that term in ORS 174.116. 4 5 (5) "Major disaster" means any event defined as a "major disaster" under 42 U.S.C. 5122(2). (6) "Special government body" has the meaning given that term in ORS 174.117. 6 (7) "State-declared emergency" means an emergency that is the subject of a declaration 7 of a state of emergency under this chapter. 8 9 SECTION 2. ORS 401.534 and 401.536 and sections 3 and 4 of this 2023 Act are added to and made a part of ORS chapter 401. 10 SECTION 3. (1) The Oregon Public Assistance Grant Account is established as an account 11 12in the Oregon Disaster Response Fund. The account consists of moneys appropriated by the 13 Legislative Assembly for deposit in the account and any other moneys deposited into the account pursuant to law. 14 15 (2) Moneys in the account are continuously appropriated to the Oregon Department of 16 **Emergency Management for:** (a) Providing grants to local governments, special government bodies, federally recog-1718 nized Indian tribes and nonprofit organizations to repair or replace critical infrastructure 19 or restore economic centers impacted by state-declared emergencies that are not federally 20 declared disasters; (b) Providing grants to local governments, special government bodies, federally recog-2122nized Indian tribes and nonprofit organizations to match federal moneys available through 23the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Public Assistance Program to repair or replace public facilities and infrastructure following state-declared emergencies that are 2425federally declared disasters; and (c) Providing funding to state agencies and nonprofit organizations for emergency re-2627sponse activities, including emergency protective measures and debris removal, performed at the direction of the department: 28(A) During state-declared emergencies that are not federally declared disasters; and 2930 (B) Following state-declared emergencies that are federally declared disasters, to match 31 federal moneys available through the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Public As-32sistance Program. (3) The department may adopt rules necessary for the administration of this section. 33 34 SECTION 4. (1) The Oregon Individual Assistance Grant Account is established as an 35 account in the Oregon Disaster Response Fund. The account consists of moneys appropriated by the Legislative Assembly for deposit in the account and any other moneys deposited 36 37 into the account pursuant to law. 38 (2) Moneys in the account are continuously appropriated to the Oregon Department of **Emergency Management for:** 39

40 (a) Providing grants to individuals and households for basic emergency assistance costs
 41 following state-declared emergencies that are not federally declared disasters;

(b) Providing grants to individuals and households who are ineligible or otherwise unable
to apply for federal individual assistance disaster grants for basic emergency assistance costs
following state-declared emergencies that are federally declared disasters;

45 (c) Providing crisis counseling services, disaster case management and legal services re-

lating to state-declared emergencies to individuals and households; 1 2 (d) Providing grants to locally established long-term recovery groups following statedeclared emergencies; and 3 (e) Paying costs associated with the coordination and distribution of assistance described 4 in this section. 5 (3) The department may adopt rules necessary for the administration of this section. 6 (4) As used in this section, "basic emergency assistance costs" includes shelter, trans-7 portation, repairs and other immediate needs following an emergency. 8 9 SECTION 5. ORS 401.534 is amended to read: 401.534. (1) The Oregon Disaster Response Fund is established in the State Treasury, separate 10 and distinct from the General Fund. Moneys received from federal grants for disaster response ef-11 12 forts shall be deposited into the Oregon Disaster Response Fund. Moneys in the fund are contin-13 uously appropriated to the Oregon Department of Emergency Management to be used to: (a) Help state agencies and local government units with immediate disaster response and re-14 15 covery efforts related to federally declared disasters in this state or state-declared emergencies; 16 and 17(b) Implement long-term hazard mitigation measures after a federally declared disaster in this 18 state or a state-declared emergency during the period of immediate recovery from the disaster or emergency. 19 (2) The Oregon Disaster Response Fund may receive gifts, grants, bequests, endowments and 20donations from public and private sources for purposes related to the fund. 2122(3) The department shall adopt rules for the disbursement of moneys from the Oregon Disaster Response Fund. 23(4) If there are expenditures from the Oregon Disaster Response Fund, the Director of the 24 Oregon Department of Emergency Management shall report to the Emergency Board, or to the 25Legislative Assembly if it is in session, on: 2627(a) The nature and severity of the disaster or emergency; (b) The actual and projected deposits into the fund; 28(c) The sources of actual and projected expenditures from the fund; 2930 (d) The nature of in-kind donations received; and 31 (e) The rationale for expenditures and allocation of payments to state agencies and local gov-32ernment units. (5) Following the final expenditure for a particular disaster or emergency, the director shall 33 34 issue a final report to the Emergency Board, or to the Legislative Assembly if it is in session. The report must include an aggregate description of the factors described in subsection (4) of this sec-35 36 tion. 37 SECTION 6. ORS 401.536, as amended by section 5, chapter 76, Oregon Laws 2022, is amended 38 to read: 401.536. (1) The Oregon Local Disaster Assistance Loan and Grant Account is established as an 39 account in the Oregon Disaster Response Fund. The account consists of moneys appropriated by the 40 Legislative Assembly and any other moneys deposited into the account pursuant to law. 41 (2) Moneys in the account are continuously appropriated to the Oregon Department of Emer-42 43 gency Management for: (a) Providing loans to qualified recipients to match, either in full or in part, moneys from federal 44 programs for federally declared disaster relief that require a match; 45

1 (b) Providing loans and grants to qualified recipients, for the purpose of paying costs incurred 2 by qualified recipients in response to federally declared disasters;

3 (c) Providing loans and grants to qualified recipients for the purposes of paying costs incurred 4 by qualified recipients in response to disasters that are not federally declared disasters, as deter-5 mined by the Legislative Assembly, if all loans and grants provided under paragraphs (a) and (b) of 6 this subsection have been repaid, fulfilled or otherwise satisfied and moneys remain in the account; 7 and

8 (d) Subject to subsection (5) of this section, paying the department's expenses for administering
9 loans made from the account under paragraph (a) of this subsection.

(3) Loans made under subsection (2)(b) or (c) of this section shall be repaid pursuant to such
terms and conditions as may be established by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services.
Loans made under subsection (2)(b) or (c) of this section may be interest free, or bear interest at a
rate established by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services. Amounts repaid on loans
made under subsection (2)(b) or (c) of this section shall be deposited in the General Fund.

(4) The Oregon Department of Emergency Management shall deposit into the account anyamounts repaid on loans made under subsection (2)(a) of this section.

(5) The department may not charge the account more than five percent of the maximum amount
in the account during a biennium for administrative expenses attributable to a loan made under
subsection (2)(a) of this section.

(6) An applicant may apply to the department for a loan under subsection (2)(a) of this section.
The department shall consider the application, make a recommendation and submit the application and recommendation to the Local Disaster Assistance Review Board established under subsection (7) of this section.

24 (7) The department shall establish a Local Disaster Assistance Review Board to:

(a) Review the recommendations of the department regarding loans under subsection (2)(a) of
 this section;

(b) Approve, by a majority vote of members, the amount of any loan under subsection (2)(a) ofthis section; and

(c) Approve, by a majority vote of members, the terms and conditions of any loan under sub section (2)(a) of this section.

31 (8) The review board shall include:

(a) Three members of county governing bodies, with at least one member representing a county
 from east of the crest of the Cascade Mountains, with membership determined by the Association
 of Oregon Counties;

(b) Three members of city governing bodies, with at least one member representing a city from
east of the crest of the Cascade Mountains, with membership determined by the League of Oregon
Cities;

17 offered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

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
