| 3 | " <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Task Force on Desalination is established. |
| 4 | "(2) The task force consists of 15 members appointed as follows: |
| 5 | "(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two members from among members of the |
| 6 | Senate, each member being from a different political party. |
| 7 | "(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two members from among |
| 8 | members of the House of Representatives, each member being from a different political |
| 9 | party. |
| 10 | "(c) The Governor shall appoint 11 members as follows: |
| 11 | "(A) One member representing the State Department of Agriculture; |
| 12 | "(B) One member representing the State Department of Energy; |
| 13 | "(C) One member representing the Department of Environmental Quality; |
| 14 | "(D) One member representing the Water Resources Department; |
| 15 | "(E) One member representing the State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries; |
| 16 | "(F) One member representing an association representing Oregon ports; and |
| 17 | "(G) Five at-large members. |
| 18 | "(3) The task force shall study the creation of a statewide desalination program. In con- |
| 19 | ducting the study, the task force shall consider program viability and development strategies |
| 20 | and may consider other issues related to the creation of a statewide desalination program, |
| 21 | as determined by the task force. |
| 22 | "(4) The task force may consult with experts, hear testimony from affected persons and |
| 23 | collect data and information necessary to carry out the task force's duties. |
| 24 | "(5) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the |
| 25 | transaction of business. |
| 26 | "(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting |
| 27 | members of the task force. |
| 28 | "(7) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. |
| 29 | "(8) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint- |
| 30 | ment to become immediately effective. |
| 31 | "(9) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson |
| 32 | or of a majority of the voting members of the task force. |
| 33 | "(10) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force. |
| 34 | "(11) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and |
| 35 | may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative |

1 Assembly related to water no later than September 15, 2024.

2 "(12) The Water Resources Department shall provide staff support to the task force.

"(13) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task force are nonvoting
members of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity only.

5 "(14) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are 6 not entitled to compensation or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the 7 task force.

8 "(15) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist 9 the task force in the performance of the duties of the task force and, to the extent permitted 10 by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the task 11 force consider necessary to perform their duties.
