

## HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2931

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after “cannabis” insert “; creating new provisions; amending ORS  
2 475C.009, 475C.017, 475C.021, 475C.025, 475C.037, 475C.045, 475C.053, 475C.061, 475C.157, 475C.177,  
3 475C.225, 475C.249, 475C.261, 475C.265, 475C.273, 475C.285, 475C.473, 475C.477, 475C.485, 475C.509,  
4 475C.517, 475C.544 and 475C.548; and prescribing an effective date”.

### “CANNABIS REFERENCE LABORATORY

8

9 **“SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2023 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 475C.005 to**  
10 **475C.525.**

11 **“SECTION 2. (1) The State Department of Agriculture, in consultation with the Oregon**  
12 **Health Authority and the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission, shall establish a**  
13 **cannabis reference laboratory to provide regulatory and technical support in the enforce-**  
14 **ment of ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525, 475C.540 to 475C.586, 475C.600 to 475C.648, 475C.770 to**  
15 **475C.919 and 571.260 to 571.348.**

16 **“(2)(a) The cannabis reference laboratory established under subsection (1) of this section**  
17 **must be able to verify current analytical methods, and develop new analytical methods, for**  
18 **testing marijuana items, industrial hemp and industrial hemp commodities or products as**  
19 **described in ORS 475C.544, 571.281, 571.330 or 571.333 and confirm test results from labora-**  
20 **tories licensed under ORS 475C.548 or accredited under ORS 475C.560 at the request of the**  
21 **authority, commission or department.**

22 **“(b) At the request of the authority, commission or department, the cannabis reference**  
23 **laboratory must be able to provide ongoing laboratory quality control samples to laboratories**  
24 **licensed under ORS 475C.548 or accredited under ORS 475C.560.**

25 **“(c) The cannabis reference laboratory is not required to be licensed under ORS 475C.548**  
26 **or accredited under ORS 475C.560.**

27 **“(3) The authority, commission and department may independently require a marijuana**  
28 **item, industrial hemp or an industrial hemp commodity or product to be tested by the**  
29 **cannabis reference laboratory if the authority, commission or department has reason to be-**  
30 **lieve that the marijuana item, industrial hemp or industrial hemp commodity or product is**  
31 **not in compliance with ORS 475C.544, 571.281, 571.330 or 571.333, regardless of whether the**  
32 **marijuana item, industrial hemp or industrial hemp commodity or product has undergone**  
33 **testing described in ORS 475C.544, 571.281, 571.330 or 571.333 at a laboratory licensed under**  
34 **ORS 475C.548 or accredited under ORS 475C.560.**

35 **“(4) If a test conducted by the cannabis reference laboratory of a marijuana item, in-**

1 industrial hemp or industrial hemp commodity or product yields results different than the re-  
2 sults of a test conducted by a laboratory licensed under ORS 475C.548 on the marijuana item,  
3 industrial hemp or industrial hemp commodity or product, the authority, commission or de-  
4 partment may invalidate the results of the test conducted at the laboratory licensed under  
5 ORS 475C.548.

6 “(5) A law enforcement agency may request that the cannabis reference laboratory con-  
7 duct testing to assist the law enforcement agency in investigations related to cannabis.

8 “(6) The department may charge a fee to the authority, the commission or a law  
9 enforcement agency in an amount reasonable to reimburse the department for the costs in-  
10 curred in conducting testing at the cannabis reference laboratory at the request of the au-  
11 thority, commission or law enforcement agency.

12 “(7) The authority, the commission and the department, in consultation with one an-  
13 other, may adopt rules to carry out this section.

14 “**SECTION 3.** (1) Section 2 of this 2023 Act becomes operative on January 1, 2024.

15 “(2) The Oregon Health Authority, the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission and the  
16 State Department of Agriculture may take any action before the operative date specified in  
17 subsection (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the authority, commission and de-  
18 partment to exercise, on and after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this sec-  
19 tion, all of the duties, functions and powers conferred on the authority, commission and  
20 department by section 2 of this 2023 Act.

22 **“LICENSED LABORATORIES**

23  
24 “**SECTION 4.** ORS 475C.009 is amended to read:

25 “475C.009. As used in ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525:

26 “(1) ‘Adult use cannabinoid’ includes, but is not limited to, tetrahydrocannabinols,  
27 tetrahydrocannabinolic acids that are artificially or naturally derived, delta-8-tetrahydrocannabinol,  
28 delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol, the optical isomers of delta-8-tetrahydrocannabinol or  
29 delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol and any artificially derived cannabinoid that is reasonably determined  
30 to have an intoxicating effect.

31 “(2) ‘Adult use cannabis item’ means:

32 “(a) A marijuana item; or

33 “(b) An industrial hemp commodity or product that exceeds:

34 “(A) The concentration of adult use cannabinoids established by the Oregon Liquor and  
35 Cannabis Commission, in consultation with the Oregon Health Authority and the State Department  
36 of Agriculture, by rule; or

37 “(B) The greater of:

38 “(i) A concentration of more than 0.3 percent total delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol; or

39 “(ii) The concentration of total delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol allowed under federal law.

40 “(3)(a) ‘Artificially derived cannabinoid’ means a chemical substance that is created by a chem-  
41 ical reaction that changes the molecular structure of any chemical substance derived from the plant  
42 Cannabis family Cannabaceae.

43 “(b) ‘Artificially derived cannabinoid’ does not include:

44 “(A) A naturally occurring chemical substance that is separated from the plant Cannabis family  
45 Cannabaceae by a chemical or mechanical extraction process;

1 “(B) Cannabinoids that are produced by decarboxylation from a naturally occurring cannabinoid  
2 acid without the use of a chemical catalyst; or

3 “(C) Any other chemical substance identified by the commission, in consultation with the au-  
4 thority and the department, by rule.

5 “(4) ‘Cannabinoid’ means any of the chemical compounds that are the active constituents derived  
6 from marijuana.

7 “(5) ‘Cannabinoid concentrate’ means a substance obtained by separating cannabinoids from  
8 marijuana by:

9 “(a) A mechanical extraction process;

10 “(b) A chemical extraction process using a nonhydrocarbon-based solvent, such as water, vege-  
11 table glycerin, vegetable oils, animal fats, isopropyl alcohol or ethanol;

12 “(c) A chemical extraction process using carbon dioxide, provided that the process does not in-  
13 volve the use of high heat or pressure; or

14 “(d) Any other process identified by the commission, in consultation with the authority, by rule.

15 “(6) ‘Cannabinoid edible’ means food or potable liquid into which a cannabinoid concentrate,  
16 cannabinoid extract or dried marijuana leaves or flowers have been incorporated.

17 “(7) ‘Cannabinoid extract’ means a substance obtained by separating cannabinoids from  
18 marijuana by:

19 “(a) A chemical extraction process using a hydrocarbon-based solvent, such as butane, hexane  
20 or propane;

21 “(b) A chemical extraction process using carbon dioxide, if the process uses high heat or pres-  
22 sure; or

23 “(c) Any other process identified by the commission, in consultation with the authority, by rule.

24 “(8)(a) ‘Cannabinoid product’ means a cannabinoid edible and any other product intended for  
25 human consumption or use, including a product intended to be applied to the skin or hair, that  
26 contains cannabinoids or dried marijuana leaves or flowers.

27 “(b) ‘Cannabinoid product’ does not include:

28 “(A) Usable marijuana by itself;

29 “(B) A cannabinoid concentrate by itself;

30 “(C) A cannabinoid extract by itself; or

31 “(D) Industrial hemp.

32 “(9) ‘Consumer’ means a person who purchases, acquires, owns, holds or uses marijuana items  
33 other than for the purpose of resale.

34 “(10) ‘Deliver’ means the actual, constructive or attempted transfer from one person to another  
35 of a marijuana item, whether or not there is an agency relationship.

36 “(11) ‘Delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol’ or ‘delta-9-THC’ means  
37 (6aR,10aR)-6,6,9-trimethyl-3-pentyl-6a,7,8,10a-tetrahydro-6H-benzo[c]chromen-1-ol.

38 “(12) ‘Delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinolic acid’ or ‘delta-9-THCA’ means  
39 (6aR,10aR)-1-hydroxy-6,6,9-trimethyl-3-pentyl-6a,7,8,10a-tetrahydro-6H-benzo[c]chromene-2-carboxylic  
40 acid.

41 “(13) ‘Designated primary caregiver’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 475C.777.

42 “(14)(a) ‘Financial consideration’ means value that is given or received either directly or indi-  
43 rectly through sales, barter, trade, fees, charges, dues, contributions or donations.

44 “(b) ‘Financial consideration’ does not include marijuana, cannabinoid products or cannabinoid  
45 concentrates that are delivered within the scope of and in compliance with ORS 475C.305.

1 “(15) ‘Homegrown’ means grown by a person 21 years of age or older for noncommercial pur-  
2 poses.

3 “(16) ‘Household’ means a housing unit and any place in or around a housing unit at which the  
4 occupants of the housing unit are producing, processing, possessing or storing homegrown  
5 marijuana, cannabinoid products, cannabinoid concentrates or cannabinoid extracts.

6 “(17) ‘Housing unit’ means a house, an apartment or a mobile home, or a group of rooms or a  
7 single room that is occupied as separate living quarters, in which the occupants live and eat sepa-  
8 rately from any other persons in the building and that has direct access from the outside of the  
9 building or through a common hall.

10 “(18) ‘Immature marijuana plant’ means a marijuana plant that is not flowering.

11 “(19) ‘Industrial hemp’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 571.269.

12 “(20) ‘Licensee’ means a person that holds a license issued under ORS 475C.065, 475C.085,  
13 475C.093 [or], 475C.097 or **475C.548**.

14 “(21) ‘Licensee representative’ means an owner, director, officer, manager, employee, agent or  
15 other representative of a licensee, to the extent that the person acts in a representative capacity.

16 “(22)(a) ‘Manufacture’ means producing, propagating, preparing, compounding, converting or  
17 processing a marijuana item, either directly or indirectly, by extracting from substances of natural  
18 origin.

19 “(b) ‘Manufacture’ includes any packaging or repackaging of a marijuana item or the labeling  
20 or relabeling of a container containing a marijuana item.

21 “(23)(a) ‘Marijuana’ means the plant Cannabis family Cannabaceae, any part of the plant  
22 Cannabis family Cannabaceae and marijuana seeds.

23 “(b) ‘Marijuana’ does not include:

24 “(A) Industrial hemp; or

25 “(B) Prescription drugs, as that term is defined in ORS 689.005, including those containing one  
26 or more cannabinoids, that are approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration and  
27 dispensed by a pharmacy, as defined in ORS 689.005.

28 “(24) ‘Marijuana flowers’ means the flowers of the plant genus Cannabis within the plant family  
29 Cannabaceae.

30 “(25) ‘Marijuana items’ means marijuana, cannabinoid products, cannabinoid concentrates and  
31 cannabinoid extracts.

32 “(26) ‘Marijuana leaves’ means the leaves of the plant genus Cannabis within the plant family  
33 Cannabaceae.

34 “(27) ‘Marijuana processor’ means:

35 “(a) A person that processes marijuana items in this state; or

36 “(b) A person that holds a license issued under ORS 475C.085 and processes industrial hemp  
37 commodities or products pursuant to ORS 571.336.

38 “(28) ‘Marijuana producer’ means a person that produces marijuana in this state.

39 “(29) ‘Marijuana retailer’ means a person that sells marijuana items to a consumer in this state.

40 “(30)(a) ‘Marijuana seeds’ means the seeds of the plant Cannabis family Cannabaceae.

41 “(b) ‘Marijuana seeds’ does not include the seeds of industrial hemp.

42 “(31) ‘Marijuana wholesaler’ means a person that purchases marijuana items in this state for  
43 resale to a person other than a consumer.

44 “(32) ‘Mature marijuana plant’ means a marijuana plant that is not an immature marijuana  
45 plant.

1 “(33) ‘Medical grade cannabinoid product, cannabinoid concentrate or cannabinoid extract’  
2 means a cannabinoid product, cannabinoid concentrate or cannabinoid extract that has a concen-  
3 tration of adult use cannabinoids that is permitted under ORS 475C.620 in a single serving of the  
4 cannabinoid product, cannabinoid concentrate or cannabinoid extract for consumers who hold a  
5 valid registry identification card issued under ORS 475C.783.

6 “(34) ‘Medical purpose’ means a purpose related to using usable marijuana, cannabinoid pro-  
7 ducts, cannabinoid concentrates or cannabinoid extracts to mitigate the symptoms or effects of a  
8 debilitating medical condition, as defined in ORS 475C.777.

9 “(35) ‘Noncommercial’ means not dependent or conditioned upon the provision or receipt of fi-  
10 nancial consideration.

11 “(36)(a) ‘Premises’ includes the following areas of a location licensed under ORS 475C.005 to  
12 475C.525 or 475C.548:

13 “(A) All public and private enclosed areas at the location that are used in the business operated  
14 at the location, including offices, kitchens, rest rooms and storerooms;

15 “(B) All areas outside a building that the commission has specifically licensed for the processing,  
16 wholesale sale or retail sale of marijuana items; and

17 “(C) For a location that the commission has specifically licensed for the production of marijuana  
18 outside a building, that portion of the location used to produce marijuana.

19 “(b) ‘Premises’ does not include a primary residence.

20 “(37)(a) ‘Processes’ means the processing, compounding or conversion of:

21 “(A) Marijuana into cannabinoid products, cannabinoid concentrates or cannabinoid extracts;  
22 or

23 “(B) Pursuant to ORS 571.336, industrial hemp or industrial hemp commodities or products into  
24 industrial hemp commodities or products that contain cannabinoids and are intended for human  
25 consumption or use.

26 “(b) ‘Processes’ does not include packaging or labeling.

27 “(38)(a) ‘Produces’ means the manufacture, planting, cultivation, growing or harvesting of  
28 marijuana.

29 “(b) ‘Produces’ does not include:

30 “(A) The drying of marijuana by a marijuana processor, if the marijuana processor is not oth-  
31 erwise producing marijuana; or

32 “(B) The cultivation and growing of an immature marijuana plant by a marijuana processor,  
33 marijuana wholesaler or marijuana retailer if the marijuana processor, marijuana wholesaler or  
34 marijuana retailer purchased or otherwise received the plant from a licensed marijuana producer.

35 “(39) ‘Propagate’ means to grow immature marijuana plants or to breed or produce marijuana  
36 seeds.

37 “(40) ‘Public place’ means a place to which the general public has access and includes, but is  
38 not limited to, hallways, lobbies and other parts of apartment houses and hotels not constituting  
39 rooms or apartments designed for actual residence, and highways, streets, schools, places of  
40 amusement, parks, playgrounds and areas used in connection with public passenger transportation.

41 “(41) ‘Registry identification cardholder’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 475C.777.

42 “(42) ‘Total delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol’ or ‘total delta-9-THC’ means the sum of the concen-  
43 tration or mass of delta-9-THCA multiplied by 0.877 plus the concentration or mass of delta-9-THC.

44 “(43)(a) ‘Usable marijuana’ means the dried leaves and flowers of marijuana.

45 “(b) ‘Usable marijuana’ does not include:

1 “(A) Marijuana seeds;

2 “(B) The stalks and roots of marijuana; or

3 “(C) Waste material that is a by-product of producing or processing marijuana.

4 “**SECTION 5.** ORS 475C.017 is amended to read:

5 “475C.017. (1) The Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission has the duties, functions and pow-

6 ers specified in ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525 **and 475C.540 to 475C.586** and the powers necessary or

7 proper to enable the commission to carry out the commission’s duties, functions and powers under

8 ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525 **and 475C.540 to 475C.586**. The jurisdiction, supervision, duties, functions

9 and powers of the commission extend to any person that produces, processes, transports, delivers,

10 sells, [or] purchases **or tests** a marijuana item in this state. The commission may sue and be sued.

11 “(2) The duties, functions and powers of the commission specified in ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525

12 **and 475C.540 to 475C.586** include the following:

13 “(a) To regulate the production, processing, transportation, delivery, sale [and], purchase **and**

14 **testing** of marijuana items in accordance with the provisions of ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525 **and**

15 **475C.540 to 475C.586**.

16 “(b) To issue, renew, suspend, revoke or refuse to issue or renew licenses for the production,

17 processing, [or] sale **or testing** of marijuana items, or other licenses related to the consumption of

18 marijuana items, and to permit, in the commission’s discretion, the transfer of a license between

19 persons.

20 “(c) To adopt, amend or repeal rules as necessary to carry out the intent and provisions of ORS

21 475C.005 to 475C.525 **and 475C.540 to 475C.586**, including rules that the commission considers nec-

22 essary to protect the public health and safety.

23 “(d) To exercise all powers incidental, convenient or necessary to enable the commission to ad-

24 minister or carry out the provisions of ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525 **and 475C.540 to 475C.586** or any

25 other law of this state that charges the commission with a duty, function or power related to

26 marijuana. Powers described in this paragraph include, but are not limited to:

27 “(A) Issuing subpoenas;

28 “(B) Compelling the attendance of witnesses;

29 “(C) Administering oaths;

30 “(D) Certifying official acts;

31 “(E) Taking depositions as provided by law;

32 “(F) Compelling the production of books, payrolls, accounts, papers, records, documents and

33 testimony; and

34 “(G) Establishing fees in addition to the application, licensing and renewal fees described in ORS

35 475C.065, 475C.085, 475C.093 [and], 475C.097 **and 475C.548**, provided that any fee established by the

36 commission is reasonably calculated not to exceed the cost of the activity for which the fee is

37 charged.

38 “(e) To adopt rules regulating and prohibiting advertising marijuana items in a manner:

39 “(A) That is appealing to minors;

40 “(B) That promotes excessive use;

41 “(C) That promotes illegal activity; or

42 “(D) That otherwise presents a significant risk to public health and safety.

43 “(f) To regulate the use of marijuana items for other purposes as deemed necessary or appro-

44 priate by the commission.

45 “(g) To establish pilot programs, of not more than three years in duration, to expand access to

1 marijuana for medical use for registry identification cardholders and designated primary caregivers,  
2 as defined in ORS 475C.777.

3 “(h) To regulate the processing, transportation, delivery, sale [*and*], purchase **and testing** of  
4 artificially derived cannabinoids in accordance with the provisions of ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525 **and**  
5 **475C.540 to 475C.586**.

6 “(i) To regulate the testing and labeling of inhalant delivery systems, as defined in ORS  
7 431A.175, that include industrial hemp-derived vapor items, as defined in ORS 475C.540, that are sold  
8 in this state by any person.

9 “(3) Fees collected pursuant to subsection (2)(d)(G) of this section shall be deposited in the  
10 Marijuana Control and Regulation Fund established under ORS 475C.297.

11 “**SECTION 6.** ORS 475C.021 is amended to read:

12 “475C.021. Subject to any applicable provision of ORS chapter 183, the Oregon Liquor and  
13 Cannabis Commission may purchase, possess, seize, transfer to a licensee or dispose of marijuana  
14 items as is necessary for the commission to ensure compliance with and enforce the provisions of  
15 ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525 **and 475C.540 to 475C.586** and any rule adopted under ORS 475C.005 to  
16 475C.525 **and 475C.540 to 475C.586**.

17 “**SECTION 7.** ORS 475C.025 is amended to read:

18 “475C.025. The Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission may, by rule or order, provide for the  
19 manner and conditions under which:

20 “(1) Marijuana items left by a deceased, insolvent or bankrupt person or licensee, or subject to  
21 a security interest, may be foreclosed, sold under execution or otherwise disposed.

22 “(2) The business of a deceased, insolvent or bankrupt licensee may be operated for a reasonable  
23 period following the death, insolvency or bankruptcy.

24 “(3) A secured party, as defined in ORS 79.0102, may continue to operate at a premises for which  
25 a license has been issued under ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525 **or 475C.548** for a reasonable period after  
26 default on the indebtedness by the debtor.

27 “**SECTION 8.** ORS 475C.037 is amended to read:

28 “475C.037. (1) The Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission may not license an applicant under  
29 the provisions of ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525 or 475C.548 if the applicant is under 21 years of age.

30 “(2) The commission may refuse to issue a license or may issue a restricted license to an ap-  
31 plicant under the provisions of ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525 **or 475C.548** if the commission makes a  
32 finding that the applicant:

33 “(a) Is in the habit of using alcoholic beverages, habit-forming drugs, marijuana or controlled  
34 substances to excess.

35 “(b) Has made false statements to the commission.

36 “(c) Is incompetent or physically unable to carry on the management of the establishment pro-  
37 posed to be licensed.

38 “(d) Has been convicted of violating a federal law, state law or local ordinance if the conviction  
39 is substantially related to the fitness and ability of the applicant to lawfully carry out activities  
40 under the license.

41 “(e) Is not of good repute and moral character.

42 “(f) Does not have a good record of compliance with ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525 **or 475C.540 to**  
43 **475C.586** or any rule adopted under ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525 **or 475C.540 to 475C.586**.

44 “(g) Is not the legitimate owner of the premises proposed to be licensed, or has not disclosed  
45 that other persons have ownership interests in the premises proposed to be licensed.

1 “(h) Has not demonstrated financial responsibility sufficient to adequately meet the requirements  
2 of the premises proposed to be licensed.

3 “(i) Is unable to understand the laws of this state relating to marijuana items or the rules  
4 adopted under ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525 **and 475C.540 to 475C.586.**

5 “(3) Notwithstanding subsection (2)(d) of this section, in determining whether to issue a license  
6 or a restricted license to an applicant, the commission may not consider the prior conviction of the  
7 applicant or any owner, director, officer, manager, employee, agent or other representative of the  
8 applicant for:

9 “(a) The manufacture of marijuana, if:

10 “(A) The date of the conviction is two or more years before the date of the application; and

11 “(B) The person has not been convicted more than once for the manufacture or delivery of  
12 marijuana;

13 “(b) The delivery of marijuana to a person 21 years of age or older, if:

14 “(A) The date of the conviction is two or more years before the date of the application; and

15 “(B) The person has not been convicted more than once for the manufacture or delivery of  
16 marijuana; or

17 “(c) The possession of marijuana.

18 “**SECTION 9.** ORS 475C.045 is amended to read:

19 “475C.045. A license issued under ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525 **or 475C.548:**

20 “(1) Is a personal privilege.

21 “(2) Is renewable in the manner provided in ORS 475C.033 **or 475C.548**, except for a cause that  
22 would be grounds for refusal to issue the license under ORS 475C.037.

23 “(3) Is revocable or suspendible as provided in ORS 475C.265.

24 “(4) Is transferable from the premises for which the license was originally issued to another  
25 premises subject to the provisions of ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525 **or 475C.540 to 475C.586**, applicable  
26 rules adopted under ORS 475C.005 to 475C.525 **or 475C.540 to 475C.586** and applicable local ordi-  
27 nances.

28 “(5) If the license was issued to an individual, expires upon the death of the licensee, except as  
29 provided in ORS 475C.025.

30 “(6) Does not constitute property.

31 “(7) Is not alienable.

32 “(8) Is not subject to attachment or execution.

33 “(9) Does not descend by the laws of testate or intestate devolution.

34 “**SECTION 10.** ORS 475C.053 is amended to read:

35 “475C.053. (1) Prior to receiving a license under ORS 475C.065, 475C.085, 475C.093 [or], 475C.097  
36 **or 475C.548**, an applicant shall request a land use compatibility statement from the city or county  
37 that authorizes the land use. The land use compatibility statement must demonstrate that the re-  
38 quested license is for a land use that is allowable as a permitted or conditional use within the given
