82nd OREGON LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY -- 2023 Regular Session

## House Bill 3087

Sponsored by Representative LEVY B, Senator HANSELL; Senator WEBER

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes Task Force on Elk and Deer Damage Compensation Funding. Sunsets task force on January 2, 2025. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to a task force on elk and deer damage compensation funding; and declaring an emergency.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Task Force on Elk and Deer Damage Compensation Funding is es-5 tablished.

6 (2) The task force consists of 13 voting members and two nonvoting members, appointed

7 as follows:

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(a) One voting member from each of the following six counties that are affected by elk

9 and deer damage, appointed by the respective boards of county commissioners of the coun-10 ties:

11 (A) Baker County.

12 (B) Grant County.

13 (C) Morrow County.

14 (D) Umatilla County.

15 (E) Union County.

16 (F) Wallowa County.

(b) One voting member who represents private crop insurance, appointed by the Eastern
 Oregon Counties Association.

(c) One voting member who represents the Pendleton office of the Oregon State Univer sity Extension Service, appointed by the Eastern Oregon Counties Association.

(d) One voting member who represents the State Department of Fish and Wildlife, ap pointed by the State Fish and Wildlife Director.

(e) One voting member who represents the State Department of Agriculture, appointed
by the Director of Agriculture.

(f) One voting member who represents the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian
 Reservation, appointed by the Board of Trustees of the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla
 Indian Reservation.

(g) One voting member who represents the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, appointed
 by the Eastern Oregon Counties Association.

30 (h) One voting member who represents the Oregon Hunters Association, appointed by the

31 Eastern Oregon Counties Association.

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(i) One nonvoting member who is a member of the Senate, appointed by the President 1 2 of the Senate. (i) One nonvoting member who is a member of the House of Representatives, appointed 3 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. 4 (3) The task force shall: 5 (a) Investigate elk and deer damage on private, agriculture lands in the six counties de-6 scribed in subsection (2)(a) of this section. 7 (b) Make recommendations concerning an elk and deer damage compensation funding 8 9 pilot program overseen by the State Department of Agriculture that would sunset after three years of implementation, including recommendations on the amount of funding needed. 10 (4) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the 11 12transaction of business. 13 (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting members of the task force. 14 15 (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-16 ment to become immediately effective. 17 18 (8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the task force. 19 (9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force. 20(10) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, and may 2122include recommendations for legislation, to a committee or interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to natural resources no later than September 15, 2024. 23(11) The Legislative Policy and Research Director shall provide staff support to the task 24force. 25(12) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task force are nonvoting 2627members of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity only. (13) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement for 28expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force. 2930 (14) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist 31 the task force in the performance of the duties of the task force and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the task 32force consider necessary to perform their duties. 33 34 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2023 Act is repealed on January 2, 2025. SECTION 3. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 35 36 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect 37 on its passage. 38

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
