House Bill 3114

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Prohibits hotelkeeper or innkeeper from requiring qualified victim services program that facilitates reservation or rental of guest room in hotel or inn to disclose personal information of victim of domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2023 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 699.005 to 5 699.060.

- 6 **SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section:**
- 7 (a) "Personal information" means the following information that identifies an individual:

8 (A) Driver license, driver permit or identification card number;

9 (B) Name;

10 (C) Address; and

11 (D) Telephone number.

12 (b) "Qualified victim services program" means:

(A) A nongovernmental, nonprofit, community-based program receiving moneys admin istered by the state Department of Human Services or the Oregon or United States Depart ment of Justice, or a program administered by a tribal government, that offers safety
planning, counseling, support, advocacy services or assistance in locating shelter to victims
of domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking; or

(B) A sexual assault center, victim advocacy office, women's center, student affairs center, health center or other program providing safety planning, counseling, support, advocacy services or assistance in locating shelter to victims that is on the campus of or affiliated with a two- or four-year post-secondary institution that enrolls one or more students who receive an Oregon Opportunity Grant.

(c) "Victim" means a person seeking shelter, safety planning, counseling, support or ad vocacy services related to domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking at a qualified victim
services program.

(2) A hotelkeeper or innkeeper may not require a qualified victim services program that
facilitates a reservation or rental of a guest room in a hotel or inn to disclose a victim's
personal information.
