SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Requires [Department of Justice] Legislative Revenue Officer and Legislative Policy and Research Director to study [Oregon State Lottery] revenue sharing models for distribution of Oregon State Lottery revenues to Indian tribes in Oregon that operate casinos. Directs [department] director to submit findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to gambling not later than September 15, 2024.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2	Relating to Oregon State Lottery.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) The Legislative Revenue Officer and the Legislative Policy and Research
5	Director shall jointly study revenue sharing models for distribution of Oregon State Lottery
6	revenues to Indian tribes in Oregon that operate casinos.
7	(2) As part of the study, the Legislative Revenue Officer shall:
8	(a) Research historical revenues from the Oregon State Lottery;
9	(b) Research potential revenue increases from new legalized gambling in Oregon; and
10	(c) Develop potential revenue sharing models.
11	(3) As part of the study, the Legislative Policy and Research Director shall:
12	(a) Research fiscal policies adopted in other states relating to gambling revenues; and
13	(b) Research policies adopted in other states relating to gambling regulation.
14	(4) The director, in collaboration with the Legislative Revenue Officer, shall prepare a
15	report describing the results of the study, which may include recommendations for legis-
16	lation. The director shall submit the report to the interim committees of the Legislative
17	Assembly related to gambling regulation no later than September 15, 2024.
18	SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2023 Act is repealed on January 2, 2025.

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
