

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3260

By COMMITTEE ON EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT, GENERAL GOVERNMENT, AND
VETERANS

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “liquids;” delete the rest of the line and line 3 and
2 insert “and declaring an emergency.”.

3 After line 3, insert:

4 “Whereas the 2020 wildfires ravaged the Santiam Canyon and in particular the remote town of
5 Detroit; and

6 “Whereas the public gas stations in Detroit, along with the worker housing, were destroyed by
7 the wildfires; and

8 “Whereas a local fuel station owner has rebuilt the public fuel station with new, state of the
9 art, self-service capable pumps in order to provide fuel for both local residents and travelers; and

10 “Whereas the community has a severe worker shortage due to limited housing and other re-
11 sources; and

12 “Whereas Detroit offers the only public fueling station within 20 miles to the west and over 50
13 miles to the east; and

14 “Whereas this fueling station is essential for economic recovery and wildfire resilience, and
15 serves a public safety need providing fuel for generators and public safety equipment; and

16 “Whereas this change is temporary and will sunset after allowing time for the area to recover
17 and rebuild; now, therefore,”.

18 Delete lines 5 through 31 and delete page 2 and insert:

19 “**SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, ‘2020 wildfires’ includes all wildfires within**
20 **Marion County that were identified in an executive order issued by the Governor in accord-**
21 **ance with the Emergency Conflagration Act under ORS 476.510 to 476.610 between August 1**
22 **and September 31, 2020.**

23 “**(2) Notwithstanding ORS 480.320, 480.330, 480.340 and 480.349, and subject to ORS 480.344,**
24 **a filling station, service station, garage or other dispensary where Class 1 flammable liquids**
25 **are dispensed at retail may permit a customer to use or manipulate a device for dispensing**
26 **liquids into the fuel tank of a motor vehicle or other retail container, regardless of whether**
27 **an owner, operator or employee of the dispensary is present at the dispensary if:**

28 “**(a) The dispensary is located within a city of Marion County that was directly impacted**
29 **as a result of the 2020 wildfires; and**

30 “**(b) The city described in paragraph (a) of this subsection is located at least 15 driving**
31 **miles from another city with a retail dispensary, measured by the shortest distance by public**
32 **roads between the two dispensaries.**

33 “**(3) Sales under subsection (2) of this section do not make a filling station, service sta-**
34 **tion, garage or other dispensary where Class 1 flammable liquids are dispensed at retail**
35 **subject to any provisions of ORS 480.315 to 480.385 regulating nonretail facilities.**

1 “(4) This section does not prohibit, limit or condition any dispensing of Class 1 flammable
2 liquids or diesel fuel otherwise authorized under ORS 480.315 to 480.385.

3 “SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2023 Act is repealed on January 2, 2029.

4 “SECTION 3. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
5 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect
6 on its passage.”.

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
